Monday January 17th

I went over to Herb Lewis this morning & telephone to town and find out when Harry Dyer's funeral was but Herb wasn't at home so I walked up to Hurway Lane and Mrs. Evans called up and found it was at 1:30 tomorrow. I came home by way of the Lampkins. Dave had Reg. helping him cut some wood and it was noon by the time I got home. I got a little more done to the calf pen this afternoon, put hinges on the door and made a gate for the inside opening. Much milder & sunny to day. Will Ryser died yesterday of pneumonia & Will Dinnington

Tuesday January 18th

I didn't get much but Chores done this morning except put hinges on the gate I made. Frank & George were over for a short time to tell us that they were going to open the silver cases again tomorrow and wanted Mary to be sure to get down early. The pictures have come but Dad has not opened them yet. I drove down right after dinner and went to Harry Dyer's funeral. From there I went down to Auntie's for awhile. Walter & Louise came up on Saturday so they have quite a house full. Dad had a telegram from Aunt Katie this morning saying Annie was dead.

Auntie had a letter from her saying she was very ill with pneumonia and she was very anxious about her. Dick and Quint left at 3:45 for New York. From Auntie I went to Bill Loring's and got some feed and I called in at Uncle Ward's to pay my Marticultural fee and in at the farm for a few minutes so it was nearly dark when I got home and a very nasty east storm had developed. Sue was here all day so I drove her home while I was hocked up. Mary had tea ready when I got back so I did the Chores all up after tea which made me pretty late. Mary feels tough to night. Much milder
