Leave rain bear to day
Sept 19 went to Harrisonville with Robert Armstrong to the cattle
show came home with him slept all night there.

20 came home to day from young in the forenoon worked
at the church with 3 Mr Cornicks & Captain Wm
Cornet & the Revd Mr Wier made a bridge
in front of the church & drew 5 loads of gravel
& sand

21 drew water for the house then 2 loads of sand
for J A Bradley 40 bushel drew rails for
to fix the fence round the corn

22 Revd Mr Wier preached this mornning & the
Mr Taplin in the evening

23 drew 4 loads of dung out of the new corn
stable in the forenoon cut the last of the corn

24 drew 4 loads of dung from the hog pen to the garden

25 separated the lambs from the ewes & marked them
heavy rain this afternoon drew 3 loads of stones
to the stable

26 drew 9 loads of stones to the stable

27 Do 7 Do Do Do in the forenoon

28 picked the stones of the church field & sowed
plowed & scraped a ditch in it

29 the Revd Mr Taplin preached this mornning heavy
rain in the afternoon & at night no meeting
went down to the schoolhouse no one come except
Mr Wier & Mr Wier

30 drew 7 loads of sand & gravel to the Barnyard
