teacher home who is out
riving the people about preparing
for the picnic.

June 21.

June 21st 1893.
Very unpleasant, the hottest weather
for some I ever experienced, some
appearance of rain to-night.

June 22

Still another very hot day. a light fall
of rain during the night.

June 23

Still very hot. Thunder storm passing
to the north and south of us, with
only a few drops here.

June 24

Another hot day, but a little
cooler than it has been of
late, went to practice to-night
in the Church. Mrs Gates
organist. Miss Madam having
gone to Montreal.

June 25

Cool this morning. had a fine
shower this forenoon and
remained partly cloudy.
The rest of the day the New Minister
preached his first sermon to-night
and I assisted in the choir
in honor of the occasion.
