Mr. Smith Cummington Island 28th April
 A fine Day creped to Hallowell and left my canoe
 went to Summerstown Pond Charles
 Parissa for 7 bushel got from him crockies 5 cent
 creped on the Steamer & Ferry The W.M. On
 first trip to Day to Summerstown Mr Woods and
 Captain Baker on Board went up to Waggoners
 Hotel as they thought they flagged her
 Bought of 3 Pairs of Boots 5. 25^c Bought of me
 8 yds of Linley L. Cotton \$2.75 yds 1.4 yds of overalls stuff 60 cents
 Thread 2 cents Bag 28 cents Bought of I Somay 7 bushel 50
 5 lb. Soap 25 cents Broom 10 cents 20 cents Tobacco 5
 Bought of 3 yds 25 cents Bally Bowes took me & our
 Sheep at Summerton high 25^c got my canoe
 like I used it and came home about
 11 o'clock I rec'd a fine afternoon turned
 Windy about 2nd went home in time as my canoe
 Leaked bad I borrowed from Harriet to
 Doctor when going on the boat owing
 Wheat at Hamlin's Planted hillsy Potato
 in the Back Garden naming Blooming 30th
 Spreading Blooming Trimmed the Apple tree
 Before the door removed the Hedges
 the calves pasture 2 row Boats went down
 and 10th 1st of May 1880 when went down
 Windy Blooming hard cold Anna Greening
 found a Dick and a Brown on the Brook sugar Bush. Now
 set some fires where it would burn chopping stove in
 lots of snow on those mountains hard frost last
 night very windy times cold Snow 2^d a fine day 3^r
 rising Canoe cleaning the Millhouse S. Set a hen
 to hatch with 10 Duck eggs there is no duck with
 her but the Rooster so I am going to try them
 Making soap I creped to Summers town Bought of Mr Ward
 25 lbs of Cornmeal 50 cents on credit 2 shools had 1.6 shot paid 1.6
 and paid John Summers 2 shools of bread & butter and 25
 dollars for Gabriel Dennis got a bag of plaster at Hamlin
 Randolph and Stock Danner there.

Mr. Smith Cummington Island 17th May 1880
 taking the Banking out of the cook house took the Box of ashes
 out at the Spa Ascension Day cold Windy I creped to
 Wood for the old man The Solling Garrison has the Pitt Point
 buying the ticks went with the old man to his nets
 North East Head got crane in the B.C. trap 8th
 among the values Pasture fence trimming trees pull the 3
 values together in the East Apple East Wind lighting a few
 gun Shuster this evening Mr Burd the Fisherman came
 to Day to Wh with Mr Brewster 10th Sugging the bushes
 10th Planted 147 hills of Potatoes along the East & North
 side of the old chimney 12th the Sennays here from the
 Kill Hill for 3 Boxes they left since last fall all taking
 the calves Pasture larger 13th killed the first calf
 but the wind up the swamp 14th 16th the
 15th June I creped to Summers town Bought
 1.5 Summers Solley Hill 1.75 yds of Tea 83 Pennys
 Bread 28 cents Salt Peter 3^c a Basket of Potatoes 15
 cents yesterday for 20th to Lancaster 2.8 got 4 Loaves
 rope him 25 cents Mr Sennay's wife the Butcherat
 unles departed yesterday Pete Grants daughter
 brought a mesh of wife to St. Helens got the
 bush A. J. Baker moving his Barn Mr
 Patterson etc the front took the Kent 16th
 garden and Young's Park there 17th just Hough
 Planted a Strip of Potatoes 18th Hough 15th June
 fence trimming rails & 20th Planted 23 rows
 of corn Hough tried the piece of the lower
 point its rather hard to plough a few days
 the Spilltan went down with colors his
 young the late afternoon commenced they are
 13 ad. ticks plenty 12th Making garden fence
 2nd Planted 6 Rows of Corn 23rd a fine day half West
 wind 24th Queens Birth Day sent Grandad shirt to
 Merritts with Mr Durfee he got a letter
 and 2 papers from Dan with 2 in it.
