

Mrs Robbs called. Lydia called in the evening.

Tue Jan 3 Fine and very cold. Lydia called with frost.  
Mrs Robbs called. Lydia Rose and Aunt Nellie at 8:00  
station for frost.

Wed Jan 4 Fine and cold sleeping nearly all day. Aunt Mattie  
called at Mrs Kiley's and Mrs Keomans. The girls  
here in evening rain and sleet in night.

Thu Jan 5 Panel and skated nearly all day. Aunt Mattie  
had was sick all night. Lydia, Henry Cook  
and Miss Taylor called.

Fri Jan 6 Fine and foggy over but icy. I called at mothers  
and at Aunt. Mr Robb called.

Sat Jan 7 Fine but cold. Aunt Nellie at morning church.  
I went to evening church. Anna and Lydia called.  
Mrs Jane Pines but all we wanted. Aunt Mattie called  
at Mr Robbs mother and children here in evening.

Sun Jan 8 Fine and mild.

Mon Jan 9 A very cold north wind blowing at first. Lydia is  
called to say good bye. She was married at  
four o'clock. We got our first egg.

Sun Jan 11 Fine and very cold. I blew you in and flew.  
Tue Jan 12 Fine and still very cold. I blew you.

Mr Lawrence called also Mr Chapman.

Annie here in the evening.

Wed Jan 13 A little more cool and milder. The sun  
a little more in the sky. I was out in the  
evening, the oldest at the sink.

Thu Jan 14 Fine but very cold a good deal of snow drifted  
through the night. Aunt Nellie had a cold. Anne  
had for dinner. Willie and Mary called in  
the afternoon. I went to evening church.

Fri Jan 15 Fine day but very cold. Thomas P. C. called. Aunt Nellie  
and William for a while in the afternoon.

Sunday Jan 22. Very cold and windy and quite a lot of flying  
snow. Chased and cold. Isabel 75cts called.

Monday Jan 23. Fine and still cold but bright. Mr. Wilcox Brown  
called in the afternoon. Aunt Nella at 8.60 meeting

Tuesday Jan 24. Fine and moderately cold. Supper in at home and  
then the sick and setting.

Wednesday Jan 25. Fine and cold a little light snow this morning  
my cold and windy in afternoon I went to  
S. S. Conover's afternoon and evening  
Anna Mathews here for tea.

Thursday Jan 26. Fine and cold good sleighing. Aunt Matilda called  
at Mrs. Kelly's and Mrs. Ly. Smalls.

evening church. I walked to village in afternoon.  
Tuesday 29th here for tea.

Wednesday 30th Nellie with rain from the east not heavy.  
Aunt Nellie and I at the Park Concord School at 10:30  
Wednesday 31st Fine day and a little colder rather slippery.

Wednesday 31st Mrs Martin called she will come for you.  
Wednesday 31st Fine and colder Nellie took luggage things down  
a little later in the evening.

Thursday Feb 1. Fine light day very cold and a trifle N.W.  
wind. Came here in the evening.

Friday Feb 2. Fine but very cold frost. I took gear and a blanket  
in place! Went Nellie at village in afternoon  
at Esther and Mary Chapman's Lizzie home.

Saturday Feb 3. Fine and very cold wind a trifle gale from  
the North west. Chose at Mrs Hall for the  
luggage. I went to the Park in the evening  
it was below zero.

Sunday Feb 4. Rather milder but a little over and raw. Went  
Nellie at morning church. I went to evening church  
comes after church. Nellie called for a few minutes  
in the evening.

Monday Feb 5. Fine but very cold as usual. I went to Suttle's 3:30  
Mrs Day called, also Mrs Wimley, and Mr Linley  
in the evening.

- Sun Feb 6. Fine and moderately cold. Mr. Peeler called in eve.  
Wed Feb 7. Fine but very cold. Aunt Mattie at McPherson for a  
little while. I went to Coonard 8:00 for dogs.
- Thu Feb 8. Very cold and below zero. Little flurry of snow.  
extremely cold in the evening. A + I called on the Jones.
- Fri Feb 9. Very cold & below zero. Annie and I sat with  
Willie. Willie sat with us and how for tea.
- Sat Feb 10. Very cold & below zero. 12 below at 9:00 at night and  
strong N.W. wind all day. Mr. Peeler here in eve.  
I went to the bank for a while.
- Sun Feb 11. Below zero and very cold. Below zero. Aunt Mattie at  
morning church. There was 77 ships sunk with tonnage  
during first 10 days in February. I went to the

Sun Feb 13. Moderately cold and a little hazing in the evening.

Fri. Mar. 2. Fine light day cold and thawing. I went to  
the Park for a while in the evening.  
Sun rose fine and bright but very cold. I went in to a  
luncheon. Aunt Nellie at morning church. I went  
to evening church. Anna called after church.  
Mar. 3. A long day: evening about the second of the  
month. Oxford School at the Park.

Sat. Mar. 4. Fine light day and moderately cold. Aunt  
Nellie at Mother's on while in afternoon.  
Sun Mar. 5. Fine day and much milder. I had going  
visibly! Nellie took Aunt Nellie out for  
drive. Aunt Nellie at later dinner. I read  
out in the evening. Nellie Read here. Mrs Shatto  
called in the evening, started to knit and  
Purrsong. Fine after a heavy rain last night, very  
sloppy.

Sat morn. Still wind but taking the sand. The water  
rained and nearly too red but went dry  
ditch and got it away quickly.

Sat morn. Fine bright day and still slushing nearly  
you and many tugged out. I was at bed for  
a while in evening started to eat in bed.

Fri Morn. Still cold rainy. Then started to rain at noon  
I went to morning church. Tents put out, I  
went in to my husband's house at noon  
and took a storm at five o'clock

Mon Morn. Fine and mild. Slushing nearly over very icy.  
Sat morn. Fine day moderately cold. Aunt Nellie at Bed time.  
Wed morn. Fine day. Uncle Chapman had cleaned his boat.  
Thus morn. Fine but cold. Four girls there. We girls  
all went down to Legion. the first band I  
ever saw. Children's Carnival at the Bank  
Fri morn. Fine and mild. Bright sun taking the sand  
water over the end a little. Made Nellie seal  
onto closed kitchen cupboard!

Sat Morn. St Patrick's day passed leisurely until noon  
then a strong wind. water very high and  
too rough but added to walk over it.  
I called in at Bank. Mr Leystoff did.

Sun Mar 18 Fine but very cold wind. Aunt Nellie at morning church. Aunt Nellie and I sat after Confirmation Service. Cousin called in afternoon. Aunt Mattie and I sat with her to eat dinner. She is better and getting up.

Mon Mar 19 Fine but cold down to zero in evening. Aunt Mattie called to see Tom Kelly and I sat with them. Mrs Martin and Mrs Ann called. Due Mar 20 Fine and bright, roads muddy. Aunt Nellie and I sat Dr Langstaff's funeral. John took her for tea, a little.

Tue Mar 21 Fine and warmer. Mrs Atkinson called. Aunt Nellie and I went up to service, but now due Mar 22 Fine and moderately warm, roads few muddy. We all went to Brook. Aunt Mattie got a new jacket, black mink. Cousin here in the evening. Hobbs and Blackbird.

Wed Mar 23 Fine at first then started to rain. Mrs White called. Aunt Mattie clearing cellar, laundry. Then we washed kitchen walls. Aunt Nellie and I went out to Millinery shop. Thunder and rain in evening. Mrs Clark and William here in evening.

Sat Morn Fine but cold wind all day skating at the  
bank but soft. Connie and Lizzie called in  
the afternoon.

Sun Morn Fine and bright. Aunt Nellie and I at  
morning church. I went to evening church  
Connie had recitals. Furnaces let out.

Tues Morn Fine and very warm. Mrs Danison and Osborne  
had the first day out. Lizzie and Abby Ward  
also Wilson Smith called. Wind quite here  
Sun mostly clouded heavily most of the day. Then it was  
heavy rain and blizzard. Aunt Nellie at K.C.  
morning we put on coal ashes.

Wed Morn Fine but a strong wind. Our sister skating.  
Sun mostly fine but very windy and cold. Connie called also  
Mrs Robles! Mr Wilson called. Rained through night  
Sun Morn Fine and bright. I went to see Walter Sunday  
about fixing antenna called at Millier's.

Thurs Morn Fine and cold until eve a little showe.  
Evenings April fool much warmer but dull. Brown  
here all morning. Rained heavily in afternoon  
Mrs and Mrs Miller took tea for tea. I went to  
evening church.

Fri Morn Rained heavily most of the day we prepared  
the action day, as it leaked and going to  
have it cemented. got washed.

- Sun Apr. 3. Fine and very windy we washed red corral  
Will called in the afternoon with matty.  
Mrs Davison called Aunt Mattie out to village.
- Wed Apr. 6. A fine warm day, dying up nicely. we cleaned  
theing room carpet upstairs, and did a few  
tables and chairs in chamber that table  
and son painting but when 75 and 70 for of paint  
was all. Aunt Nellie at Mother's and at for  
her bonnet. Mrs Brooking and Mrs Atkinson here
- Thur Apr. 7. Rained heavily then shifted about two inches of rain  
we pumped again to empty cistern. <sup>leaking</sup> from roof
- Fri Apr. 8. Good Friday. Rained and digged root of bay  
and horribly sticky, not pumped dry again.
- Sat Apr. 9. Rainy morning. Sunshiny in afternoon.
- Sun Apr. 10. Very cold & rainy. Mr Larchy cemented  
cistern. Katie Chapman here in afternoon.
- Mon Apr. 11. Easter Sunday. Aunt Nellie and I at church.  
cold and hot bright we went to evening church.
- Tues called in the afternoon.
- Mon Apr. 9. Fine but very, very cold and quite a frost. Aunt  
E. and little Mattie and I walk around to Aunt Higgins for  
Tea. Easter Monday. Got frost for macrolabo.
- Sun Apr. 11. Fine but very cold with high wind. I went  
out to macrolabo and we put store room carpet  
down. Mr Ladd called. Aunt Nellie at Oakwood.

Wed Apr 11 Fine and a little warmer made duty books  
and Annie here for tea and trailer here.

Other days fine and moderately cold we cleaned our  
red rooms and flat down setting room carpet,  
table, etc, all done upstairs. I called it  
New Room. Mr. Brown called.

Fri Apr 12 Fine but colder again. I went up to see  
new church about connecting pipe to water.  
Sat Apr 13 Fine but still cold snow still lying in sheltered  
places over rocks.

Sun Apr 14 Fine and moderately cold. Aunt Nellie at church.  
I went for a walk and found Willie in the  
afternoon. Virginia had married. Annie called  
in the afternoon made my duty. Aunt Nellie  
and I at evening church. Mr. Brown away.

Mon Apr 15 Fine day. we looked - did - driving road Captain  
Larsen Apr 17 Fine and much warmer. We cleaned chamber  
and wood shed. Most people seedling.

Tues Apr 18 Fine and much warmer cleaned cellar - a  
lovely day so warm. Mrs. Pebbles called.

Thurs Apr 19 Fine but cold east wind. we did some yard  
work and chores and wash. Aunt Nellie  
varnished chairs, etc., a shower in eve.  
Annie and Legge here in evening.

Sun Apr 21 Fine and very very warm after we cleaned all  
our clothes. Uncle Eddie planted a Hibiscus  
tree Canyon here in the evening. A thunder  
storm about ten o'clock and a good rain  
filled later first time it was uneventful. Sun to

Fri Apr 22 Fine but dull and cool. grass growing after rain.  
Aunt Nellie and I at Wiseite at Redwood.  
Aunt Mattie in at Redwood in afternoon.  
Sun Apr 23 Fine and moderately warm. Aunt Nellie at church.  
Willie and Mary here stayed for early tea.  
Aunt Nellie and I at Wiseite church.

Mon Apr 24 Fine and bright all we cleaned Parlor and Dining room  
and did finishing with the all done cleaning.  
Tue Apr 25 Fine but cool. Auntie at Redwood. Mrs. Weston  
called.

Wed Apr 26 Fine but cold east wind. Aunt Mattie, Annie  
and I in afternoon bought Pears. chores in  
Sun Apr 27 Rained a little dull and cool. I went to Redwood  
all in evening. Pears came. Aunt Mattie and  
I eat salad hot and bacon.

Thu Apr 28 Fine but very cold. Aunt Nellie out calling  
Mrs. Shatto called. Floor 1500 - a 44 - net  
got 3 44, 675

Wed April 26 Fine but very cold. Aunt Willie and Mrs. Higby  
and the girls yard, got my hat \$2.50

Thur April 27 Fine but cold, east wind. Aunt Willie and I at  
morning church. I went to evening church.  
a little showy Anna had after church.

Fri April 28 Fine warm day and very bright in afternoon.  
I went to town in afternoon to return for a  
mortgage of Uncle's a watch walked out to  
Willie in the afternoon we washed. Mr. &  
Mrs. called in afternoon.

Sat May 1. May-day very cold disagreeable wind after  
a heavy wind through night and heavy sun.  
Wed May 2. Fine but very cold and windy. Mary Nelson here.  
Thu May 3. Fine but cold and windy. Mr. Dinsdale here. Howard  
Fri May 4. Fine and bright. Mrs. Cox and Howard called also  
Mr. Pebble and Miss Pebble in the evening.  
We planted beans.

Sat May 5. Blown gently most of the day from east.  
I called at Mrs. Atkinson in afternoon.

Sun May 6. Cool and cold east wind. Mrs. Dinsdale and Emma  
were in the morning. I went to Willow for tea  
and a Memorial service for Eddie Bond.  
Aunt Willie at our church and called on  
Howard.

Mon May 7 Fine and moderately warm. Aunt Matilda taught  
South French. Mrs. Robbie called Aunt Nellie  
at Miss Edges in the evening.

Tues May 8 Fine and quite warm. packed boxes for  
the toy. Aunt Nellie at Red Cross Meeting  
in the evening. Aunt Matilda and I left three  
littlets in the evening. three come.

Wed May 9. Aunt Nellie went to Toronto to visit Eggi  
Nelson. Smallie, Blantons tree, came - a  
show in afternoon. Then colder.

Thurs May 10 Fine but very cold wind. Aunt Matilda taught  
South French and stepped the chain.

Fri May 11 Fine but cold and windy. a little snow  
of sun. Mr. and Mrs. Robbie here for tea.

Sat May 12 Fine but cold wind. Mary Watson here  
in the evening.

Sun May 13 Fine and a little warmer. Aunt Nellie at  
morning church. Mother, Anna Higgins and Nigels  
called. We all went to evening church. the first  
time for such Music recently.

Mon May 14 Fine but cool with wind. Mrs. White Stone turned  
He and I to see the river with Mr. Mc Donald  
in the evening.

Sun May 12 Fine bright day but cold wind. We all went to Weston for the day. George taught us back to ear. Wed May 13 Cold and cool or little warmth in afternoon. My sister could come Chapman here.

Thur May 14 Fine and warm. Mr. Nelson Smith and Donald called also Don & Howard worked their quilt & quilted. Fri May 15 Fine and much warmer. Mabel and I stayed with the Misses Barker called in evening. Aunt Mattie and I called at Mrs. Harriet Robinson.

Sat May 16 Fine until eve - a thunder storm and heavy rain started. which will do much good. I went to Toronto, one at Centreville and called at Dennis Wright.

Sun May 17 Fine and cooler. Aunt Willie at morning church. we all went to evening church.

Mon May 18 Fine until evening it came on snow.

Tue May 19 Rainy from the east all day steadily going away. It being a good working day I took the train in the eve. and Mattie at Weston. Aunt Willie at home and at MacLennan's.

Wed May 20 Fine but cold west winds and a few clouds. I went to Weston with wool in the evening.

Thur May 21 Fine with the exception of clouds and very very cold west winds. we all spent the day at McLean's Empire day.

On May 25 Fine but still cool I went down to see Florence  
found in the evening a number of Aeroplanes  
passed over.

Tue May 26 Fine day and much warmer. Auntie and I  
went for a walk out the mill road and to  
the cemetery.

Wed May 27 Fine bright day. Aunt Nellie at morning church.  
Connie and Mother called. We all went to  
evening church. fine and warmer.

Thu May 28 Fine until we it came a little shower, washed,  
put in some Cobblers. I called at Mrs. Vandye.

Fri May 29 Fine bright and warmer. Auntie and I in  
Toronto. Aunt Matie a hat. Aunt Nellie does  
and I got material for her.

Sat May 30 <sup>lightning</sup> Fine but cold, Mrs. Martin called  
out and warm. Bob Brown Mrs. Peffer called  
I have tea for tea. a heavy rain started  
at eight and continued. Mrs. Martin called

Sun June 1 Good bright warm day after rain, tried going  
out. did fine apples yesterday. eat <sup>good</sup> 40 lbs 4 pts  
4 quarts in all. Aunt Matie called at Mrs.  
Vandye our fire out a couple of days.

Did our fire Wed. 20 lbs each.

I weigh 127 lbs.

Sat June 2 Fine but cool light a little fire Mary Chapman called. I went for a drive with Mr. Smellic in car.

Sun June 3 Fine but dull and very cool fire We all went to evening church Annie cured

Tue June 4 Fine and warm we all drove out cutting lawn Aunt Nellie called at Mr. Wilber, Aunt Matilda and I at graveyard and called at Mr. Langstaff in evening put in all Dahlias, some tomatoes.

Wed June 5 Fine and warm a little shower in afternoon then clear and warm

Wed June 6 A cold east wind, had to light fire, Aunt Nellie called at Mrs. Edges. Some at heavy rain and thunder storm in the evening. Mr. Fairman in while storming set first match last fire

Thur June 7 A warm day but showery. Uncle came called

Fri June 8 Dull, cool and showery but fully out in leaf and blossomed out now. fire in eve. I walked out to Wilber.

Sat June 9 Fine and very warm, first in now tomato plants. Mr. Dickinson baby born. I called at Miss Hardy in evening. Showers here.

Grand is down & won't sit now or for a while

Wed June 12 Fine also sun but cool. Aunt Nellie church  
in the morning. Summer but. Annie called in  
evening. We all went to evening church. Cloudy no.  
Now good. Fine and much warmer. We called at Mrs. Shatto's  
and John's. Fine and very warm. Aunt Maggie and Mrs. Gravelle  
here for tea and we 2 car. and home. <sup>also</sup> called on  
Aunt Nellie at luncheon. Red Cross Meeting with  
Web June 13 Fine and very warm. Aunt Nellie and I called  
on Mrs. Atkinson. Mrs. Kelly and Miss Morgan  
all out so called at Mrs. Barnes. Mrs. Shatto.  
came a thunder storm in the evening  
and a heavy rain.

Thur June 14 Fine and bright at first then cloudy and  
color. Aunt Nellie called at Mrs. Watson.  
Fri June 15 Fine but very cool after a heavy rain last  
night. Aunt Nellie called at Mrs. Rogers. Aunt  
Maggie called to see Mrs. Davidson. Aunt Maggie  
to see Mrs. Kelly.

Sat June 16. Fine bright and little warmer. Aunt Maggie  
and I for a walk up by Springs. Annie  
called. Aunt Maggie & I at Mr. Head to eat  
supper. I was in to see Mrs. Davidson.  
Ruth, wife, aged 11<sup>th</sup>, legal 18<sup>th</sup> gal.  
Mrs. Walbridge died full flow.

Sun June 17. Fine and much warmer. A slight frost last night  
but we have. Aunt Nellie and I at evening church.  
Mother and Annie here in the afternoon very busy.  
We all went to evening church.

Mon June 18. Fine until noon a terrific rain and thunder storm.  
Aunt Mother and I in court. I got my dress fitted in  
the eve.

Tues June 19. Fine and quite warm. Aunt Nellie at Mrs. Park's  
I went to Miss Mandeville's again called.

Wed June 20. Fine at first then shower in afternoon Mrs.  
Garrison up and being well names left yesterday.

Thurs June 21. Fine after a heavy rain last night. got word  
Mrs. Wallbridge dead. got my dress finished

Fri June 22. Fine and hot and cold. I walked to Park in the  
evening took lettuce called Miss Hilda gave a Party  
Sat June 23. Rainy all afternoon. A great youth the past  
two weeks. We all had tea at Mrs. Park's.

Sun June 24. Aunt Nellie at church. fine but still all day.

We all went to evening church called at Mrs. Tom. Sun.

Mon June 25. Fine bright day. we washed.

Tues June 26. Fine after a heavy rain in the night. Irene  
Chapman called by lot and entry. Mr. Lawrence  
called. Aunt Nellie at Red Cross in eve.

Mr. Stone out again.






