Saturday 22th Fine all day I went to Edith's twice I went across the road we went to father's to-night

Sunday 23th Rained this morning fine the rest of the day I went to Edith's we spent the afternoon to Babe Deslippe's I had supper there Rosa Amelin and Mr Major were here this evening Cora was here this forenoon. Old {Lolk?} died
