May 15

Went to Kingslow at night Stuffed at Mr St.  
Swanston the Revd Mr Wardrop preached in St  
Annes church to a large congregation the Synod  
met at ten o'clock & there was long numbers there

16 Synod closed to day about 5 o'clock there was  
a good deal of business done rather cold weather

17 got home on the Express all well there has  
been frost every night since Monday

18 I put in six rows of the Altringham Carrat  
East of the barn & went to Delta this afternoon  
Lennie went with him Grady & Wallace came from  
the Shanty this afternoon all old piece sawed

19 Revd Mr Elliot preached this morning Mr Nicholson at night

20 fine rain last night & most of the day it has done  
a great deal of good got a Tetagon that Aunt  
Isabella was dead & that she would be buried tomorrow

21 Ellen & me went to young this morning to  
Aunt Isabellas funeral she was buried on the  
South side of Adams grave in Caintacon the  
Revd Mr Brown preached in the Presbyterian  
Church there it was well filled heavy rain at  
2 o'clock so that we could not get home

22 came home this morning all well there was  
no rain here I planted 1 row of the  
Egyptian Beet & 1 row of Bassano Beet

23 Revd Mr Green the Bible Agent he held a  
meeting in our Church Mr Phelps assisted

24 I dragged the potato ground Grady went a Bee  
of Daniel Coevans fine day

25 Grady & Lennie & all the rest went to quarry  
there is to be great day there

26 I planted 2 rows of Sugar 2 rows long Red  
Mangelwurzel East of the Barn ground dry

27 Revd Mr Nicholson preached this morning Mr Brown at  
night I took

28 Ad cultivated the potato ground & dragged the corn ground  
Grady & Lennie went to Perry sawed on the Express heavy rain  
the ground is too wet to plant Ad plowed some of the summer plow  
& placed in the summer fallow fine mowing time

29 Wallace & me went to Powersdays Corn to look  
30 I planted 3 rows of green Beet 3 rows Small East of  
the Barn I sawed some of the white Beet there 3 rows of  
31 points they are all from the north fence of the water fountain there 3 bushel of E. Ross  
the 1st of the finest potatoes next to the first 2 rows
