Baker 5 Tin Pans 1 Dollar, 1/2 Bushel of

of salt 7 in him sent a Present of a
Rudding Dish to Livina and Kassins
and sweet and Papers to the children
a Treat at supper and at 7 o'clock Mr
Phillips 7 yrs Ruth a story higher on his
house Mr Smallmans Steamer near
finished Lanchester yesterday something
to the Bush Bought of Mr Smallman 3 loaves
Called at Laflin's down on Marvilles
old Place Came home some Cold to night
got a line and 2 ears of corn from Laflin
took 10¢ paper there 16th Planting and digging
at the old house all chills planted today
windy from the north to Day Cold and fine
17th Looking and Talking Ficks of the Cotts Making the house
between the mill house and the house Mosquitos commencing
talking the Banking from the house the Steamer Royal
commenced running Mr Smallmans Steamer
4 in 2 Rounds at her Pulling manure on
the top Potatoe ground Found a Large Long Canoe
and it loaded with old slabs and pieces of
Boards it must belong to Paul do

that I could find the N. G. line. began to rain they went
off with the sleds and I saw I saw the Day turned
fine & a few warm. To day I load in now made
the road of hay cutters the weeds around the Potatoes
into the road. I saw the N. G. line. W. T.

At 1355.81 (Crimson) (Mond. May 18th 1872)
Working at the store but crossed to 5 Kershaws
took over Mrs Hamiltons Plate and cloth
I got from her with the Butter my men
came on the Steamer L Kenand Paid 10 Cents
Freight for 2 Quarts Brought a Cooler over for
James Grant to the Ashery sent 2 Papers to Charles
a Cornwall Freeholder and the Star Brought Mr
Depond 1 Coarse Comb 10 cents Paid Postage 4 cents
on the Papers sent over with George Kershaw took
Down John Hamiltons Plough for George
heard Mrs Harpers was on her last the
Royal taking over Freight the Kenand left
for Dundee Captain Rankin crossed on
her made another trip for a load of Sheep to
Dunsmuir with a scow the new Boat
Manitoba expected up to night Mr Craig taking
his Cattle to Francis (Plane) a Fortunate Day
15th Oscar Leflesh and his 3 Children and Mrs Morris
came Before Day Light Having this evening oiling
the Cotts in the Stable and taking back of
them Waxed Paddles with Oscar & taking
some of the Rubbish out of the Milk house and
fixing the Banking at the East end Planted 4 Beds of
Pot Onions Digging the Garden Caught the sheep
1st Sheared the Sheep Fixed the Ram Land
went to the Surgeon Island took the canoe
from the Bay where Daniel Gregor left it
A Fine Day sun hot The William Towing
here
