be paid in a month. Finished plowing for peas. Hauling
stone &c.

F. 19th Plowing in the afternoon

M. 20th Plowing, sold 6 hens to Mrs. Luller for 20 cents
to be paid in time.

M. 22nd Yesterday Roberts heifer Beauty took the
bull, and Roberts biggest ewe had a lamb.
This morning my little ewe had a lamb.

Robert and me cleaned up the seed peas
Plowing this afternoon, One of Roberts little
black Hoggets had a lamb.

F. 23rd Plowing, Robert hung the pork up to smoke, also the beef.
One lamb died this morning. Planted early York cab.
seed, Drumhead cab. seed and large red Tomatoes.

W. 24th. Sowed peas about $5\frac{1}{2}$ acres and 3 B. per acre
or nearly so.

Th. 25th. 1 Dozen Herrings of Eden the first of the season
Ninepence per dozen on Aft. Putting the riders in
the fence by the Godwick line on Christians place.

F. 26th. Chopping in the Gore. Father finished harrowing in peas.

M. 27th. Chopping. The wind uncovered the peas father har-
rowed yesterday morning, and he had to harrow
it again this afternoon.

M. 28th. Plowing, Yesterday Rosa was bulling but
whether she took the bull or not we do not know.

F. 30th. Father rolling peas. Commenced making garden.
Mary got mother a pair of shoes \$1.25 on life of Amos
Wafford.
