

September, 1901.

- 25<sup>th</sup> Wed. Fine day. Father and Richard were drawing manure to-day away from back of barn. This afternoon Mother, Ethel and I went to Bath. Father was home.
- 26<sup>th</sup> Thur. Fine day. Overton Benjamin was here to-day. Threshing machine came this afternoon. Had 11 men for tea. All home.
- 27<sup>th</sup> Fri. Fine day. Threshing here to-day had 12 men. Therefore we were all home.
- 28<sup>th</sup> Sat. Fine day. Threshing machine left this morning about nine O'clock. Ovy Benjamin went down to kitchen tonight. I took my lesson this afternoon. All were home had between 2000 & 3000 bushels of grain.
- 29<sup>th</sup> Sun. Rained last night, and most of the day. Ovy Benjamin came here about 6 O'clock. Tom Luren came down to night and got Mrs Bruce. We were home all day.
- 30<sup>th</sup> Mon. Fine day. Father and Richard were moving part of the straw stack to-day. Mrs Carroll washed for us this morning. This afternoon Mother did up her 6 gallon churn of crab-apples. Kelly was here a few minutes this afternoon. All were home to-day.
