

May 1910

1 Sunday. Fine in morning, cold, east wind. Not many in church. Sent no off. Had no visitors. Mr. Mrs. and Margaret Govin called after prayer meeting. I was very glad to see them. We have a few chickens from the ferry eggs, all are not out yet.

2 Drizzly day. Murdy left for Vanhook Hill. Jerry Sullivan made a pipe to lead water from roof to cistern. Jimmie got cheese account from O. Callanach \$6.57. I paid it.

3 Rain all last night and all this day. I sent a letter to Mable with family history. Sent a letter to Anna Griffin in answer to one from her I got yesterday. 4 years today since Pa. died.

4 No rain today. I am doing very little, but getting the meals to 2 loaves. I churned about 600 of bad butter, wasted more time and energy than it is worth. Had wood from Fairburn.

5 Fine day, cold wind W 7 M. P. met at John's today. I paid my fee 1.00 for 4 months off. 10<sup>cts</sup> for Presbyt. 5<sup>cts</sup> for tea. To 2 loaves 10

6 I did a small washing today

7 10.40 A. M. Wood received that King Edward died today on Friday 6<sup>th</sup>

8 John Loviollette digging the garden fore noon

9 A. M. Donalds son came with the saw to cut our wood, has a job to cut nearly 30 woods for \$8.00

10 \$5.00 to go for rent & cash. we to furnish out for the house, not to board any more, he let Loviollette work this P. M. with them.

11 Murdy came at noon, Murdy by 2 lbs butter 25. 150 50 15

8 I was in church the first time since September. Mr. Govin did not refer to the death of King Edward. Some said he prayed for the new King. I had no offering.

9 Murdy left for Glen Robertson. The men came to noon, but it began to rain.

10 Jimmie put the cows out to pasture and Katie and Fred Longboat. Sent a letter to Marion. Willie MacFerman brought me 7 eggs of Gummiken.

11 Ann Hall 1/2 day 30. High wind. The men finished the sawing. Gave \$3.00 cash. And

12 Credit for \$5.00 on M. Donalds rent. And a bag of oats

13 Bright but cold. To 2 loaves 10<sup>cts</sup>. Put a fire in the furnace

14 To butter 2 lbs 50<sup>cts</sup> rould oats 25. Murdy got home To 1 gall coal oil 18. 2 loaves 10

15 To sugar 25. Jimmie went to Cornwall with Lady Longboat drove her. And led Solomon. Far came back with him led Murrel his yearling racer to put her to pasture. Far went back by train. Weather keeps cold.

16 Fine and bright. I was in church. I did not hear Mr. Govin mention the death of the King last Sunday or today. My off 25. Had no visitors

17 Fine bright day. To 3 lbs butter 75. Wheat 10. O. cards 5. Beets 5. Parsnips 5. Lettuce 5. 1 pint onions 10

18 Fine day. Mrs. Loviollette got liberty to put paper on her house and to allow it in rent. 3 loaves 15

19 Rain this morning. Mrs. Doest (one Miss Kousa) died this morning at her son-in-law's house will be taken to the home at North Lancaster, for wake and burial.
