

September 1887

1. Thursday. Women's meeting at Mr. Monro's. We brought a bale of clothing to the N. W. for the Indians. The Branch people have a social in the Hall tonight.
2. Jimmie went to Lunenburg with the bale for 50 for freight.

I did not write for a few days so I cannot recollect dates I got 3 baskets of peaches from Sandy about the 15th. Pa went to Lunenburg and got 80 lb granulated sugar, he got cloth for a suit of clothes and gave it to Fraser to make.

Bird went to Martintown on the 12th to attend the model school. On the 18th a fire broke out on our place near Brownhouse's & Majors and Pa and the boys were ditching to stop it.

The fair took place on the 27, 28 of the month in our village. We had potatoes & exhibits. Beans, peas, wafers, now jelly, plums, cutrip. I did not hear if we got prizes. We took up our potatoes on Saturday 24th, and some of them the rest on the 29th. Monday I came home on the 23rd. There was a Lacrosse match on Saturday 24th, between the E. Leclairs of Lunenburg and the Olympic Olympians. They played 140 minutes. The Olympic won the game, and will keep the medal for a while longer.
