Iodine in Smallpox.

C. S. Rockhill finds that by painting the pustules of small-pox with a ten per cent. solution of iodine in glycerin, the pustules dry up and destruction of the tissue, with consequent pitting, is prevented. The duration of the stay in hospital is shortened. The pustules may be opened with a sterile instrument and touched with tincture of iodine. The author has treated 85 patients in this way, and all have recovered, with an average stay in hospital of twelve days.—I. A. M. A.
