- August 1 Grandman was buried to day at one o'clock  
the Rev. W. W. Gibbons preached there was  
a very large funeral. She died a few minutes before  
before twelve o'clock at night
- 2 Geordy came down this morning with Squire Elton &  
Geordy helped Charles Armstrong at his boy this afternoon  
I went over to James W. Mullins his son was found long  
yesterday it is supposed that he playing with a strap  
& got it over his head & could not help himself
- 3 went to the funeral of Robert J. W. Mullins he  
was buried at Ebenezer Church the Rev. W. W. Cochran  
preached there was a very large funeral  
over 50 teams
- 4 Geordy drew loads of sand gravel &  
stones
- 5 The Squire W. W. Cornet & Cornet & J. Reed at the  
Church we strapped one side & put up scaffolds  
for the lathing & plastering
- 6 the Rev. W. Robertson preached in the forenoon &  
the Rev. W. Cochran in the afternoon
- 7 Geordy went to Brockville with W. P. Moor  
for a load of coal I did some fixings about  
about the reaper
- 8 I worked at the reaper
- 9 Geordy cradled a seventh round the first half of  
the wheat & cut part of the Barley the reaper would  
not work in the barley
- 10 cut part of the wheat with the reaper
- 11 finished that part of the wheat it is very light  
raked up the Barley & put it in. Boone had 2  
small loads
- 12 drew in 2 small loads of wheat very dry weather.
- 13 the Rev. W. Cochran preached this forenoon
- 14 cut the south half of the oats in the center field  
Geordy helped W. W. Cornet this afternoon to cradle
- 15 Scraped a hole in the gravel pit for water  
for the cattle drew in 2 loads of oats in the after-  
noon
