Mizzling and cloudy morning gradually cleared off fine sunny P.M. Father came up in morning went down P.M. with Mary who went down to see Mrs Petrie about the \$100.00 we supposed she owed us. She got at Simmons sign for money 20 she also was at Arthurs teeth. We put binder into shed spread load of clover around to dry then took in rest of breakfast 1 1/2 loads and chopped pig A.M. P.M. we raked and loaded rest of hay in No 7 and put load wood on high waggon rack but got stuck in muck and had to take half of it off together but we brought the other half up to bank.

5 32 Mostly cloudy, cool. We cut wood with circular saw A.M. then Willie took saw No 1 over to Bowley (6) I dropped some when a wheel broke and I quit. P.M. Willie took 12 bags pig chop to mill paid 66 cts. I Rec and Mrs Heston here P.M. judged corn. We took in two loads hay from No 7 one to each barn I went down town at night paid Dolly Beattie 17 41 7 coppers for red cross paid Wm Bowley \$2.00 for saw also got tickets for concert at Mettells 70 cts settled 7 & 8 also settled to-date cheque on J.B. \$18.17 H.E. \$34.2 7 9 1475.
