One wishes that no mention of them was made in surgical text-books, for they are late symptoms, so terribly late that when they make their appearance the patient's chance of cure has probably gone, for the disease has then become extrinsic as well as intrinsic, secondary deposits have probably taken place in the glands of the neck, and life can only be saved or prolonged by the mutilating operation of laryngectomy.—Herbert Tilley; Clin.
