

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 15, 1870.

I finished drilling half of the ten acre field this forenoon. We have adopted a new plan in putting in our wheat, of harrowing after the drill. It seems to be a great improvement on the old plan.

Mr. Shurlow was here to day looking after stock. He is going to buy my Lamb or rather, has bought them at about ~~two~~ ^{two} dollars & twenty five cents per head.

Mr. Fultra one of our neighbours sent me a pup to day according to previous agreement. It is one

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 16, 1870.

We hoped to have finished our seeding to day but failed on account of rain this morning. I am afraid that we are a little so late, as there is every appearance of a heavy East storm soon. But the field is not quite all sown.

Have had a number of men here to day after cattle, sheep, pigs &c. Sold three little pigs and have partly made a bargain with Mr. Frost to exchange sheep. He lives on the Old Era. name place which is a light sandy soil. making a good charger
