Toilet Talk.

L.M.: For the unpleasant effects of perspiration bathe with a lotion of 1 ounce hydrate of chloral in 1 pin water. A good powder to be used is made of 1/4 ounce camphor in fine powder, 3/4 ounces oxide of zinc; 2 ounces precipitated chalk; 15 drops oil of roses. Rub the three last ingredients with the chalk, then add the other powders and mix thoroughly. Pass through a very fine sieve. (2) There is no adequate remedy for the shine on a serge skirt, but you may alleviate the malady by sponging with warm vinegar, or rubbing lightly with emery paper. The shine is caused by the departure of the nap.

Not for twenty-eight years has the stern old Frost King bitten this city so deeply as he did last night in the moonlight hours between midnight and six o'clock this morning. Calm, snapping, piercing cold,

that is the way everybody is describing it to his neighbor to-day, and on top of that the weather man declares that the figures recorded by the tested, unerring official thermometer in the Meteorological Office up on Bloor street, was 22 below zero. From isolated places in the city's suburbs there comes the reports which drop the mercury as low as thirty, thirty-four, and even thirty-six degrees below the zero mark, but the official figure is the one which has to be relied upon for the compliance of statistics.

Three Lower Records.

If any person wishes to beat that official record of 22 degrees below for Toronto, he must chase back through the years until he comes to February 5 of 1886, where he will find that the lowest was 22.8, and that is twenty-eight years ago. Only three times during that period for which official figures have been preserved has Toronto experienced a stiffer burst of cold than came last night, and figures are on record for the past seventy-four years. January 10, 1859, holds the record, the temperature dropping to 26.5. That was fifty-five years ago, the third time when our recent figures were beaten being fifty-nine years ago, in February of 1855, the record then being 25.4.

Sat Feb 1, Very cold with a cold, N.W. wind. Uncle and Aunt Mattie at Thornhill with butter and eggs.

Sun Feb 2, Very cold west wind, bear could see its shadow. Uncle, Aunt Nellie and I at church light the coal feeder.

Mon Feb 3 Fine and milder, We did not wash and churn. Uncle and Auntie at Thornhill helping at hall

Tue Feb 4. A very cold west wind with a few flurries. Uncle, Aunt Nellie and I at the social. we took a large piece of ham, four cakes, two loaves of bread and milk. took in \$1.76.

Wed Feb 5. Fine but a cold wind.

Thur Feb 6. Fine but very cold and windy. I went over to Marys to help her. Uncle at Mr Larose Sale.

Fri Feb 7. Cold west wind, dust blowing.

Sat Feb 8. Fine but not so cold. a few squirrels. I went to Toronto. Uncle is poorly. the Doctor out to extract his tooth.

Sun Feb 9. Fine and moderately cold. Willie here in the afternoon. the Doctor here.

Mon Feb 10. Cold east wind, below zero for the first this year. We had Mr and Mrs Smellie, Mr and Mrs Teasdale, Mr Morgan and Walshs, Willie, Marjorie and Annie to spend the evening.

Tue Feb 11. Fine and windy. Annie went home. I went to bake for Mary.

Wed Feb 12, Fine but cold wind, roads all clean and dusty. at Dr.

Sat Feb 15, A east wind, Uncle in Toronto. came snow at night.

Thur Feb 20. Fine and mild. very sloppy. Aunt Mattie at Mothers.

Sat Feb 22. Raining and sleeting very mild until night a little colder. Willies Anniversary. I went over in the afternoon. Marjorie came home with us.

Tue Feb 25, Fine but cold. Uncle at the mill.

Wed Feb 26. East wind and a little blustery. Uncle and Aunt Mattie at Uncle Smellies funeral.

Thur Feb 27. Fine day, sleighing, again. but not very good. Mr and Mrs Breakey called.

Fri Feb 28. Fine bright day, Uncle and I at Thornhill. he went to Doctor. I called at Marys in eve.

Tue Mar 11. Fine bright day. Mr Botham left. Mr Lawrence here for tea. Charlie Teasdale here in the evening roads are very muddy.

Wed Mar 12. Fine and very mild. roads are bad.

Thur Mar 13. Fine and mild. very sloppy ice nearly all gone. I called at Marys in eve.

Fri Mar 14. Fine and very, very warm. thunder at night. Aunt Nellie at W.A. meeting. Aunt Mattie and I went over to a lecture but disappointed we left when it started to thunder. Robins here today.

Sat Mar 15. A few showers then turned colder. We have a Calf very, very muddy and roads very much cut up.

Sun Mar 16. Fine but cold and windy, all frozen clean. I went to Concord church. Willies all here for dinner at night.

Mon Mar 17. Fine but cold and windy.

Tue Mar 18. Fine and moderately cold. very windy.

Wed Mar 19. Fine day and quite warm. Auntie washed for house cleaning.

Thur Mar 20. Fine and very warm. Black birds here. Auntie cleaned mans room. then cleaned cellar in the afternoon fine and warm for the work. Uncle at New Market with the Jurymen.

Fri Mar 21. Rained heavily in the morning then cleared. Good Friday. a dreadful wind in afternoon and turning colder. Uncle poorly blew chimneys down also barn roofs in many places. The Doctor here.

Sat Mar 22. Fine and quite cold, all frozen clean, I went to Toronto on G.T.R. taken on to Maple in eve.

Sun Mar 23. Fine at first, Uncle drove Aunt Nellie and I to early Communion then we walked home. It rained in the afternoon. Uncle a little better.

Mon Mar 24. Easter Monday. Clearing and very mild. washed and churned, Aunties hung bacon in afternoon Annie here in afternoon. I called at Marys

Tue Mar 25. Rained all last night and sleeting and freezing all day.

Wed Mar 26. Mild and very sloppy. I have a cold.

Thur Mar 27. Snowing and blowing most of the day. quite a depth of snow.

Fri Mar 28. Fine and moderately cold. Snow going a little Mr Clarke and Earnest here in the eve. Calf.

Sat Mar 29. Fine and mild. I have a dreadful cold. Mr Robinson buried.

Sun Mar 30. Fine and warm. I am miserable with a cold. Uncle and Aunt Nellie at church. Uncle, Aunt Nellie and I at Mrs Clarkes to tea.

Mon Mar 31. Rained early in the morning then cleared and a very high wind. Uncle finished on Jury 22 days I called at Marys in the evening.

Wed Apr 2. Fine and mild, the roads quite dry. Uncle and I went out to the Doctor. 75 cts Auntie cleaned stair and hall Carpet.

Thur Apr 3. Cold East rain all day. Uncle brought Mother and Annie out. Mrs Davidson died.

Fri Apr 4. Cold west wind with a few showers. Washed and churned. Uncle at Willies in the afternoon.

Sat Apr 5. Fine but windy.

Sun Apr 6. Fine but cold west wind we were at church. I spent the day at Mothers. Uncle and Aunt Nellie at Willies in eve.

Mon Apr 7. Fine and a little warmer. Uncle in Toronto. We cleaned Clothes closets, Uncles room and spare room. Uncles Carpet up. took our Carpet up and cleaned in the evening.

Tue Apr 8. Fine and moderately warm. Cleaned our room and put down stair Carpet and hall. Jennie Edey called My cold a little better. all upstairs finished.

Wed Apr 9. Fine bright day, roads dry. Cleaned Chamber Willies helped carry out feeder. Aunt Mattie and I called at Mrs Whites collecting.

Thur Apr 10. Cold east rain, a very bad day. set a hen.

Fri Apr 11. Fine and mild but very muddy. Aunt Mattie went collecting, Uncle went for her in the evening.

Sat Apr 12. Fine and quite mild. Started to wash outside. Mr Luesby here fixing pump. set a second hen. shot 5 Rabbits this week.

Sun Apr 13. Fine bright day. Uncle, Aunt Nellie and I at Church. frogs out first. Uncle at Willies in the evening. Aunt Mattie went to evening Church with Mrs Clarke

Mon Apr 14. Fine and warmer. washed and churned. I called at Marys in the eve. Did a little raking.

Tue Apr 15. Fine and mild. Uncle went to Thisleton with Willie. We cleaned Parlor. put in Lettuce and Onions. Marjorie and Mildred here for tea. I put on lighter Underwear.

Sat May 3. Fine and very warm. Sitting out. out bare-headed and without coat

Sun May 4. Fine and warm. dusty. Uncle and I at Church. Willies here for tea. Mr Bales. called in the evening. {written above line in pencil} "sitting out afternoon eve" Plumb and Pear blossom out.

Mon May 5. Fine and warm. trees are out in full leaf. everything has great growth. very dusty.

Tue May 6. Fine and turned cooler. I went to Richmond hill in eve for clock and watch.

Wed May 7. Fine and very cool. strong west wind. put Meat away.

Thur May 8. Fine but cold east wind. men finished seeding all but peas. - Mick went to put in his garden in the afternoon. Uncle in Toronto. I went to Marys for a while in the afternoon. frost.

Fri May 9. Fine and very cold. men ploughing. Aunt Nellie called at Marys in the afternoon.

Sat May 10. Fine and very cold thick ice this morning.

Sun May 11. Fine and a little milder Ice Uncle and Aunt Nellie at Church. Aunt Mattie and I went to Mothers and to evening Church. a lovely evening.

Mon May 12. Fine but cold. Annie here for tea. I called Miss D.

Tue May 13. Fine day. Aunt Mattie called at Mrs Welsh's.

Wed May 14. Fine and quite cool. I went to Toronto, called to see Aunt Lizzie and Aunt Nancy.

Thur May 15. Fine at first then showery and cold East wind. Uncle and Aunt Mattie at Mrs Bothams funeral.

Sun Oct 18. Fine and warm. Aunt Nellie at church. Annie and I at Willies and H.H. at Concord

Mon Oct 19. Fine and warm. Aunt Mattie and I called at Mrs. Kellys. I got apples at Miss Edeys.

Tue Oct 20. Fine and warm. Aunt Nellie in Toronto. Aunt M and I called at Miss Bowes. Mother and Mrs Watson here in eve.

Wed Oct 21. Fine and quite warm. let Range out. Aunt M and I called at Miss Corkes and Mrs Boyle. I went to Doctors in eve. Misses {illegible} called.

Thur Oct 22. Fine and still warm. Aunt M and I in Toronto at Dentists.

Fri Oct 23. Fine and warm. Aunt N and I called at Mrs Welsh and Miss Morgans out without coat every day so fine. Mrs McElroy died.

Sat Oct 24. Rained then cooler. light range again. Mary called

Sun Oct 25. Fine but much colder. Willies family here for tea. Mrs Clarke called. I went to evening church. We were at Mrs. McElroys funeral.

Mon Oct 26. Fine but very, very cold. Mrs Lawrence called

Tue Oct 27. Fine but very cold after heavy frost. all plants and flowers frozen black. I got Dahlias in.

Wed Oct 28. Fine but still cold. I called at Mrs Wilsons

Thur Oct 29. Rained gently all day. Aunt M and I in Toronto at Dentists. I got suit at Northrays \$15.00. Mary and Willie called.

Fri Oct 30. Fine but windy. Willie here moving W.C. Mr Lawrence called. I called at M. Watsons in eve.

Sat Oct 31. Hallow'een. Aunt Nellie at Mrs Langstaffs M. Watson and Mrs Riddell called. fine bright day. moderately warm

Sun Nov 1. Fine bright day until afternoon came thunderstorm but soon over. We spent the day at Willies. I went to evening church.

Mon Nov 2. Cold and windy. Mother here for tea.

Tue Nov 3. Dull at first then fine and warm. Aunt Mattie at Mothers for tea. called at M. Watsons.

Wed Nov 4. Fine day. very windy. W. Martin putting in cement for her house. I called at Miss Edeys in eve.

Thur Nov 5. Fine but cold. We all had dinner at Aunt L

Fri Nov 6. Fine day. I walked out to the old home in the afternoon no person at home. got barrel apples at Ma.

Sat Nov 7. Fine after a little shower. Mary Chapman called also Marjorie and Grant.

Sun Nov 8. Fine but cold and windy. I was at home all day. Aunt Nellie at church both times.

Mon Nov 9. Fine but cold. Aunt Mattie at the Doctors. We called at Mrs Ramans. Mrs Bowes and Mrs Danby called in afternoon.

Tue Nov 10. Rained and snowed, very slushy. Annie called

Wed Nov 11. Came heavy squawls in the afternoon. Aunt Nellie in Toronto. Grant here for dinner and Mary for tea.

Thur Nov 12. Dull and cold. Mother called in afternoon. I was there for a while in eve. Snowed in night. Xmas cakes

Fri Nov 13. A dreadful morning quite a lot of snow then it rained and took it away.

Sat Nov 14 A fine bright day. I was in Toronto got my fur \$22.50. Mrs Coy called.

Sun Nov 15. Cold and raining all day. We were not away anywhere.

Mon Nov 16. Fair but cold wind. Mick here digging the garden.

Tue Nov 17. Fine and hard frozen. could not plough. Mr Oakshott here changing the pipes. Made mincemeat. J. Edey called.

Wed Nov 18. Fine and clean frozen. I walked out to call at Willies. Ida Clarke here in the evening.

Thur Nov 19. Fine day and cold.

Fri Nov 20. Cold, Willie brought lumber. M. Watson called. David here.

Sat Nov 21. Fine but cold. William and Wilie started her house {Santa Claus went down street written above}

Sun Nov 22. Fine and very cold. Aunt Nellie at morning eh- I went to evening church with Mrs Clarke.

Mon Nov 23. Fine but cold, we washed. I went to enquire Mrs Riddell.

Tue Nov 24. Cold and blustery {Jamie Edey called written above}

Wed Nov 25. Fine and milder. Lola Clarke here for dinner. I went to Toronto on business for Auntie.

Thur Nov 26. Fine day. Mr Littles baby dead. Auntie and I called on Mrs Miller. Mother and Annie called. William here for a while

Fri Nov 27. Fine bright day. I walked out to Mrs Littles.

Sat Nov 28. Fine and bright, roads dry. I went to the funeral got apple butter \$1.70. Clara Teasdale came.

Sun Nov 29. Fine day and mild, ideal day. Aunt Nellie Clara + I at church, at Methodist in eve. John Cook here for tea. light furnace

Mon Nov 30- Rained all morning then cleared in afternoon Clara and I called at Mrs. Reamans. I left.

Tue Dec 1. Fine day but muddy. Mrs Clarke and Marjorie called in the afternoon. very foggy. furnace out.

Wed Dec 2- Fine warm day. William here and finished her house. Man started to make the road. foggy.

Thur Dec 3- Fine and colder. I went to help Annie to get ready for the club.

Fri Dec 4. Fine day and colder. Aunties and I in Toronto. Men finished road way.

Sat Dec 5. Fine day. Mother called for a while. Mr D. moved the Piano. the boys called.

Sun Dec 6. Fine bright day but cold. Aunt Nellie and I at church. I went in the evening. Willie and Mary called in afternoon.

Mon Dec 7. Fine cold day. but bright and clear. Auntie and I at Doctors in the eve. East wind. moved hens in.

Tue Dec 8. Fine but cold East wind. We light furnace.

Wed Dec 9. East wind came a little dry snow. Our Bazaar Willies children out, and stayed all night. They took in about \$180.

Thurs Dec 10. Fine day with exception of a little dry snow.

Fri Dec 11. Fine bright day. Aunt N. called in Mrs Jakes.

Sat Dec 12. Fine day. I walked to Willies. Annie called, Ida Clarke called.

Sun Dec 13. Snowing most of day. Aunt Nellie at church. I went in the eve- very bad walking. Annie called.

Mon Dec 14, Aunt Nellie went to Aunt Lizzies. Mother and Annie here for tea. Mr Lawrence called gas bad. A dreadful wind blowing snow.

Tue Dec 15. Cold and windy. Doctor here. and we went to Mothers on account of gas.

Wed Dec 16. Very cold. I was here most of the day.

Thur Dec 17 Fine but cold. Aunt Nellie came home. Dr Campbell came over to the house here.

Fri Dec 18. Fine but cold. Annie and I at Concord Christmas tree and entertainment.

Sat Dec 19. Snowed heavily then cleared at noon. the cutters out.

Sun Dec 20. Fine bright day. Aunt Nellie at church. I went in the evening. came a lot of snow in night

Mon Dec 21. A cold blustery wind. blowing tracks full. I went to Toronto called to see Aunt Nancy

Tue Dec 22. A dreadful wind, men fixing chimney

Wed Dec 23. Very cold but calm. I called at Mrs Lawrence in the eve.

Thur Dec 24. Fine but very cold

Fri Dec 25. Christmas Day. 10' below zero in some places {Toronto written above}, coldest since 1851. Skating Rink opened

Sat Dec 26. Fine bright day. We came home. I went to the Rink in the evening

Sun Dec 27./ Fine and moderately cold. Willie also Annie called miss Seager, called, and Mrs Richardson and Clarkes in the even I went to church.

Mon Dec 28./ Fine and much milder. Dr Johns called, Mrs Peebles and Miss Edey called. Pump thawed, got geese. 16 cts lb.

Tue Dec 29/ Mild with heavy snow, turning to rain. I went to Church in the evening when prizes were awarded. Nelson and Mrs. Smellie here in eve

Wed Dec 30/. Fine and a little frozen, sleighing good. Lizzie and Fanny Bowes called, also Annie and Lizzie.

Thus Dec 31. Fine bright day, all frozen hard. quite a hard frosty night. but very clear and moonlight.
