Better a little repetition than a dead or damaged patient. The removal of false teeth, rings, other constricting bands, the presence of stiff joints, nasal obstruction, etc., should be a matter of personal knowledge of the anesthetist, and this knowledge will relieve him of the responsibility of many untoward results that might otherwise ensue.—Dr. J.
