To night we had a party of young folks from Down South among the rest was a young man from near Wellington Square who has been who is acquainted with Frank Springer, Ed. Coverly. Miss Kent Miss Anne & Miss D. B. and several others were also here. We had a pleasant evening's visit from them.

Still out in other days my whole service is completed in work.

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 19, 1870.

I have had Charley cutting wood & splitting today.

I went to mill this forenoon and while the grist was grinding I went over to town. Took dinner at George Hall's. Afterwards I went down to the pond for a skate. I had some of my friends to accompany me and had a fine time. Miss Keane's Pitt was one of the accompanying folk. Carpenter, Helen Rowley and Annie Douglas. I like the latter one I had the pleasure of skating most of the time.

I got home in pretty good time with my grist although the work was very rough.

The weather is very beautiful at present & I hope it will continue.
