Tuesday March 21st 22

I went down to duck ponds and got some things to put under the seat of my riding gear and I called in at school and Chris got me a couple of wooden. I did not do much but Chores this afternoon and started to straighten our stuff around a little.

Wednesday March 22nd 23rd

I just did Chores this morning. Mary & Leah washed and Frank went over to Pickford's to see if he would come over and saw wood for us tomorrow. We won't be able to get the rest up till after seeding so thought we would get what we have up cut. Gladys presented us with a pair of twins yesterday. This afternoon we took the rock off and put the box on the wagon and Frank hauled down two loads (40 bags each) of wheat. It weighed up well and Stain said it was a good sample. It is now worth \$1.85. Dad. and I helped Lin load it and then Dad. helped me put Mary's trunks & barrels up over the wood shed. He went down town and stayed to tea and I went down after tea and went to church with her. It has been a beautiful spring like day.

Thursday March 23rd 24th

Arthur Peterson came over while we were at breakfast this morning to tell us that Aunty Maude was gone, so
