WEDNESDAY, APRIL 27, 1870.

This forenoon Charley  
and I got a couple of  
young Geese Walter  
Jelax. This afternoon  
we commenced farming  
in earnest. Plowed three  
bushels of barley and  
got it nearly harrowed  
in.

Mr & Mrs Hall came  
out this afternoon and  
made us a visit sold  
them a cow for thirty  
five dollars.
