

Saturday, May 14, 1870.

We finished up  
the ten-acre field to  
day excepting clearing  
out the furrows.

tivated up about four  
acres of wheat in front  
and I sowed most  
of it with barley.

I went out to Dover  
to night and drove  
our ~~four~~ year-old colt  
to the bluff for the  
first time.

Our girl Catherine  
left us to night in  
a very shabby way  
but I hope that it  
will be for the best.  
Many of disappointments  
occur to us but I do  
hope that I may ~~go~~ with  
Mr. Paul. Some of these  
things occur to me

Sunday, May 15, 1870.

him. We cannot serve  
two masters. O that I  
may serve Him with  
all my soul, with all  
my mind, with all  
my strength.

We had our dear  
minister with us to  
dinner to day, besides  
several others who wan-  
ted to stay to our meeting  
this afternoon. There  
was a large crowd  
as it happened to be  
the funeral service  
of James Dean's wife  
sadly deceased.

We felt to my lot to lead  
the class this afternoon.  
I had much liberty in  
performing my duties.
