We were very much surprised to see by to-day's paper
that we had had an earth quake Saturday night.
We didn't notice it here but several people in town
felt it. Cousin Willie saw the brick wall in the house
move, and Pickford felt it in bed. Down through
eastern Quebec some damage was done by it.

Tuesday March 3rd

The wind was in the south west this morning and
I thought it was a little milder so I drove over to
the farm in the cutter to see if I could get them
to help me get some more wood while the
snow was on the ground. It was down at three
Ward and Frank had to go to Pickford's to help
him kill a pig this after noon so we didn't go after wood
I went down town and got some stuff and came back
to the farm for dinner and came home soon after work.
