Clerk of the Peace the convictions of Carbon &
the account of Stacks fine & Carbon to witness
I mailed forty dollars to Ribben Fields in a
Registered letter to Malboro town fine day

24 I set up most of the day Ad drawing wood

25 gaining a little strength fine day Do

26 Rev W Mc Queen went away on the Muee this
morning Ad drew 2 loads he is helping to
them to saw at the road in the afternoon

27 Ad drew 2 loads of wood fine day Liza
and Hattie come from Delta this afternoon

28 & 29 the Rev W Mc Queen preached in the New Church this
morning W Sumner did not come saw head sum

29 Ad is drawing wood he drew 2 loads fine day

30 Ad bunked out wood Wallace attends to
the cattle fine warm day

31 Ad is at the wood heavy man at night
the roads getting bad very bad with pickholes
