- 1 Sunday. Soft, snowing & kind of hail. Far came home this morning, I did not go to church either morning or evening
- 2 I was up at 5 this morning. Far & Jimmie went at 6 to Lancaster to meet Byron McDonald's funeral, they were back to the church about 8 A.M. Dan McKesic called to see us he is looking well, he is the only one who came with the corpse. Mrs Pantimo paid \$2.75, gave 1 to Jimmie for 1 borrowed to pay Shepard, and 25 to Ken to pay Stanley. 1.00
for span bread we got last week - 25
- 3 Jimmie Murdy & Bridie went to take tea at W. Black's
- 4 I was at prayer meeting, it was very cold, not many present; Mercury down to 20
- 5 Was at Women's meeting at W. Campbell's, paid for the aprons. Aunt gave me 45 cts for hers they cost but 35 = I owe her 10. my offering was 20 & gave 10 toward the fund for paying yearly expenses of Presbyterian Society. We all spent a pleasant afternoon and evening. They came for us, and drove us home again
- 6 Snowing some all day. Sold three hides got over 4⁹⁰ got 1 lb tea 50. Bird is visiting Miss McGruer. Aunt is not able to be up yet 50
- 7 10 P.M. Storming I was to see Mrs Snider, she has a baby girl 8 days old. He got 1 broom 25
1 gall coal oil 25 ginger 5. Sold Pine 30
2 bush buckwheat - Had a letter from Sandy, which had information of the bowls. Aunt feels pretty well but is considerably swelled in the body. Our people have election fever. The polling will be on the 5th March
- 8 Kind of stormy, heavy snow not many in church
