Sun 26 I went up to J R Boarings for Hart a fine soft day

Mon 27 I drew from 2 loads of <sup>(wood)</sup> stove wood from Kalsbachers

Tues 28 I went up to O.W. Sandons to Thrash a nice barn

Wed 29 I was thrashing at Sandons all day a very blizzard

Thurs 30 I was thrashing at O.W. Sandons all day a heavy day <sup>Mr Charles Stewart died at 8 A.M. Sunday</sup>

Fri 31 We finished thrashing at noon to day a nice day but <sup>(2700 Bushels)</sup> The year ends fine but very cold

Very good sleighing but not much snow
