Sat Jan 1. New Years Day. We had the gathering fine and mild, a little foggy and the Snow going in the afternoon.

Sun Jan 2. Fine and moderately cold. Uncle, Aunt Mattie and I at Church.

Mon Jan 3. Fine morning then turned cold and flustery in the afternoon. Election day. Uncle did not go out. I called at Mrs Clarkes

Tue Jan 4. Fine but extremely cold. 7 below zero. Willies are thrashing.

Wed Jan 5. Rained and Sleeted all very Slippery. Willies could not thrash. We took our hens to the barn.

Thur Jan 6. Fine and moderately cold. good Sleighing. Aunt Mattie and I walked out to W.A. called at Mrs Henry's. The machine came at night. bad getting up lane.

Fri Jan 7. Fine and mild. thrashed and cut feed. finished about 4.30.

Sat Jan 8. Fine and moderately cold. Uncle at Mr Cross' funeral. then took me to the Rink in the evening.

Sun Jan 9. Fine day Uncle, Aunt Nellie and I at church.

Mon Jan 10. Fine but cold and frosty we washed and churned 16 pounds butter. Annie Cooper walked out in the morning.

Tue Jan 11. Fine and moderately cold. Mr and Mrs Breakey, Mr and Mrs Gibson and Ida Clarke here.

Wed Jan 12. Fine bright day splendid Sleighing Uncle and Aunt Mattie at Thornhill. Aunt Nellie at Mrs Whites in the afternoon. Uncle took me to the Carnival.

Thur Jan 13. Fine but colder East wind. Uncle in Toronto. Aunt Nellie at an extra W.A. meeting, she had dinner and tea at Mothers.

Fri Jan 14. Storming all day from East. Uncle and Aunt Nellie at Mr Clarkes to tea. Our lane pretty full but able to get through.

Sat Jan 15. Fine bright day but cold. Uncle in Toronto. I walked to the Rink, and Uncle brought me home.

Sun Jan 16. Fine day milder. Uncle, Aunt Mattie and I at evening church. The last Service with old Seats.

Mon Jan 17. Fine and mild untill afternoon it came wet Snow. I went to Toronto. got articles for the tree. I called at Aunt Lizzies. Uncle and aunt met me in sleigh, after getting Cushions at the church.

Tue Jan 18. Rained heavily in the morning. then cleared at noon. Uncle took Auntie and I to Miss Wilcox.

Wed Jan 19. Fine day a little colder, very slippery the Sleighing not quiet So good. Uncle in Toronto. Auntie and I called at Mrs Heise but she was away.

Thur Jan 20. Fine bright mild day. A little Sloppy. Uncle drove Aunt Nellie and I out to W.A. extra meeting. Dr Campbell here in the afternoon. Uncle at Thornhill in the evening. William Smellie died.

Fri Jan 21. Raining then turned to wet Snow. very Slushy. received word of Williams death and Uncle and Aunt Mattie went to Toronto on the 2.0'clock car.

Sat Jan 22. Raining heavily from the East then turned to Snowing and blowing a dreadful day. Uncle, Willie, and Aunt Nellie at Thornhill but got word that William's funeral was posponed {postponed} Mrs Dean was buried in the afternoon.

Sun Jan 23. Rather Stormy. We were at home all day.

Mon Jan 24. Fine and mild, I went to Toronto on ten car. the others on the twelve. I got my Muff. \$10, the funeral was at 2.0'clock.

Tue Jan 25. Beautiful day moderately cold. Washed, churned. Mr Atkinson and Ball called. I was at Mr Bowes party. Mr Wilcox's here in the eve.

Wed Jan 26. Fine day, untill afternoon and evening it was very rough East storm, Uncle in Toronto, very bad getting up the lane. the last time up.

Thur Jan 27. Fine and mild. John Bowes here for dinner Aunt Mattie at Willies for tea. started up field

Fri Jan 28. Fine bright day and mild. Mr and Mrs Teasdale and Annie here for tea.

Sat Jan 29. Fine bright day. I called at Mr Clarkes in the morning. Uncle took me to the rink. I have a Slight cold.

Sun Jan 30. Fine with exception of a little flurry of snow. Mrs Clarke, William and Herbert here for tea.

Mon Jan 31. Snowed a little most of the day. I went out to the Hockey Match with Eddie and Ida Clarke.

Tue Feb 1. Fine bright day, Splendid Sleighing. Uncle and Aunt Mattie called at Mrs Gibsons and Lydia Wilson. then they went to call at Mr Howards in the evening.

Wed Feb 2. Fine untill evening it Started to Storm. bear see shadow {Until early 20th century Canada used a bear instead of a groundhog for Groundhog Day – sometimes called Bear Day at that time}

Thur Feb 3. Rather Stormy untill noon it cleared. a great debth {depth} of Snow. and very light. made fruit Cake.

Fri Feb 4. {washed and churned} Fine bright day a little colder. I went to Toronto. Uncle at Newton Brook in eve. Frank and Charlie Teasdale here. Willie helping Uncle clean up wheat.

Sat Feb 5. Fine bright day but very cold. Uncle up at Richmond hill with a load of wheat. I went out to the Rink and remained at Mothers.

Sun Feb 6. Fine but very cold. 14 below zero, I came home in the afternoon. Uncle at Willies.

Mon Feb 7. Fine day. we made 100 Small Cheese Cakes and one Coconut Cake. Uncle at Richmond hill in the afternoon. bloowing a little Snow in the evening

Tue Feb 8. Beautiful day, moderately cold. We took a little over a basket of Sandwich. two fruit cakes and coconut Cake and eight dozen Cheese Cakes Proceeds \$.105. cleared.

Wed Feb 9. {Below it reads: <u>Ash Wed.</u>}Very mild untill afternoon it Started to snow and blow. Uncle at Mr Teasdales in the morning. We started to go to the Carnival but turned back on account of Storm.

Thur Feb 10. Fine but very cold. Annie Cooper walked out but remained over. Annie, Charlie and Frank Teasdale here for tea. were Snow Shoeing.

Fri Feb 11.Very cold at first then moderating. In the morning 22 below zero in some places. Uncle took Annie home. {In left margin it reads: Sat F}

Sat Feb 12. Snowing a little all day. Uncle took me to the Rink in the evening. 1 egg.

Sun Feb 13. Fine and moderately cold. Uncle, Aunt Mattie and I at Methodist Church. called at Mothers.

Mon Feb 14. Fine bright day. Uncle in Toronto, I took milk {between lines it reads: Teasdale girls called} to Mr Devlin's and he gave me two dozen eggs.

Tue Feb 15. Rather Stormy. then Sleeted and very rough. Dr Campbell here for dinner. Uncle, Aunt Mattie and I at Mr Teasdales for tea.

Wed Feb 16. Fine day moderately cold. Sessor here. I walked out to the Rink, and came home with Charlie an Clara Teasdale.

Thur Feb 17. Fine day, I called at Mary's. Uncle and Aunt Mattie at Mr Breakey's in the evening.

Fri Feb 18. Fine we had a little fresh Snow last night. Uncle down to Eglinton in the evening.

Sat Feb 19. Moderately cold, Drifting a little. I went to the Rink. Uncle down to Eglinton.

Sun Feb 20. Fine day. Uncle, Aunt Nellie and I at church at the Methodists. called at Mothers.

Mon Feb 21. A fall of wet Snow last night. Aunt Nellie and I called at Mrs Bracks, Cherry's, and Riddells, a beautiful afternoon.

Tue Feb 22. Fine bright day. Mr and Mrs Wilcox and Miss Wilcox called. We all were at Willies to tea, it Started to Storm a little at night.

Wed Feb 23. Rather Storny and drifting through the day. our gateways filled the first time Uncle went out and dug them in the evening. I got out to the Store.

Thur Feb 24. Fine bright day. I walked to the Car. went to Toronto called at Alices then for Lily Wallbridge at 574.Bathurst Street. Uncle met us at the Car. Uncle, Aunt Nellie and Lily at the Church Opening \$35;

Fri Feb 25. Fine day moderately cold. Clara and Frank Teasdale here to Spend the evening.

Sat Feb 26. Fine untill evening it rained. Uncle, Lily and I went to Mothers out Skiing and to Rink

Sun Feb 27. Very mild all day, rained in the evening {between lines it reads: 1 egg} Uncle, Lily and I at church in the eve.

Mon Feb 28. Fine and very mild watery in our field. Uncle took Lily to the car. and Lizzie came home. with him. I took milk to Mr Devlins.

Tue Mar 1. Fine and mild. Lizzie and I at Willies Uncle and Willie at Woodbridge.

Wed Mar 2. Fine and very mild, Uncle took Lizzie home in morning, 2 egg's today. Willie and Grant here. W. helping Uncle to clean up wheat. good walking on the Snow banks. the water over the road. Mrs Clarke called in the evening.

Thur Mar 3. Fine and very mild. Uncle at Woodbridge. then took Aunties to W.A. meeting. Uncle at Thornhill in the evening. I walked to Store water over.

Fri Mar 4. Fine and mild. Uncle took milk to Mr Devlins. and got eggs. Willies here for dinner at night. Mr and Mrs Henry called. Grant Sick with a cold.

Sat Mar 5. {Below it reads: no skating} Very, very mild all Sloppy. We washed and churned. Uncle digging the ditch and let water off the road. I walked to store quite dry. three eggs.

Sun Mar 6. Rather threatening thundered and lightened. Uncle and Auntie Started to Church but turned around. Auntie and I went over to see Grant Marjorie and Charlie came over for tea. another thunder and lightning Storm in eve but very little rain.

Mon Mar 7. Colder and windy. David Smellie came out for Aunt Mattie. Uncle at Newton brook in Buggy the evening. a little flurry of snow. Buggy out.

Tue Mar 8. Fine but a little blustery. I called to see Annie Teasdale. Uncle took the Shutter to Thornhill in the afternoon. roads Sloppy but water all gone.

Wed Mar 9. Fine bright day. Uncle took me out to the Rink and I remained over night. Auntie and Mother at Alices visiting, ice pretty good. Buggies out.

Thur Mar 10. Fine day I walked home in the morning. Aunt M. gone back to Givens Street.

Fri Mar 11. Fine bright day. I was at Mr Breakeys afternoon tea. thirty there. Uncle came to Mothers for me. Marjorie came over to Stay.

Sat Mar 12. Fine bright and warm. the Snow is going rapidly today. Uncle in Toronto. Skating but I did not go out. Marjorie went home.

Sun Mar 13. Cold wind and a little Squawly. We went to Church. Dr Campbell here.

Mon Mar 16-14. Fine but very high wind and freezing. We went over to Willies in the evening. We got seven eggs.

Tue Mar 17 15. Fine but cold freezing. Willie got bit with dog.

Wed Mar 18-16. Fine bright day. Sunshine all day. Uncle in Toronto to try to hire a man. I walked to the Rink and Uncle came for me. freezing hard at night.

Thur Mar 19 17. Fine bright day. Uncle at Mr Tretheweys Sale. Mr Botham came home with him. Aunt Mattie came home in the afternoon.

Fri Mar 20 18. Fine bright day. Uncle took Mr Botham away. Aunt Mattie and I called at Mrs Whites. Annie and Lizzie here for tea. Uncle took them home. I saw a Robin.

Sat Mar 21 19. Fine and very mild. Uncle brought Mother out. I went to Rink but very poor ice. watery. Robins. Blackbirds, Blue Birds and. Meadow larks all here. Thunder through the night.

Sun Mar 22 20. Fine and very mild, Soft wind. Dr Campbell called. We went to evening Church. down the lane first time.

Mon Mar 23-21. Fine mild day. We washed and churned. did up bed covers. Matress Covers. Our last churning.

Tue Mar 24 22. Fine warm day. roads all dry. Auntie cleaned Mans room and painted part. Uncle and Willie at Mr Gooderhams Sale. I called to see Annie Teasdale. sold eggs. 24 cts,

Wed Mar 25 23. Fine day mild. Auntie finished painting room We all went to Mary Watsons to tea. I called at Miss Mundeys to see about dress.

Thur Mar 26 24. Fine day very, very warm. Snow nearly all gone except in ditches. Aunties and I went to Toronto on G.T.R. Albert Lyons buried. frogs out.

Fri Mar 27 25. Good Friday. fine bright day, good roads. Mary and Marjorie here for tea. a little cooler in the eve.

Sat Mar 28 26. Fine warm day. We cleaned Cellar. fine for that work. Uncle helping Willie in the afternoon.

Sun Mar 29 27. Fine day, a little colder. <u>Easter Sunday.</u> Uncle, Aunt Mattie and I at Church. At Willies to tea.

Mon Mar 28. Fine and warm <u>Easter Monday</u>. Uncle at Vestry {Between lines it reads: cleaned chambers} Meeting. he brought Annie and Lizzie home. Willie called. He brought Annie and Lizzie home. Willie called. went to Toronto in the evening.

Tue Mar 29. Fine and Still warmer. We cleaned spare room {Between lines it reads: Aunt Nellie called to see A. Teasdale. Let Coal feeder out.} upstairs. Uncle brought white bed home and we put them to their places. Mrs Gibson called.

Wed Mar 30. Fine and very, very warm. We cleaned Uncle room took up Carpet in his and cleaned ours. were very hot working.

Thur Mar 31. A little cooler and windy. We cleaned Spare room and Parlor. took out Dining room feeder in afternoon all done now but Dining Room and Kitchen. Willie helped out with Stove. Put in Lettuice {Lettuce} Seed. Willie on land for a little.

Fri Apr 1. Fine and warm. We did gardening, raked etc. I called at Miss Phillips in the afternoon.

Sat Apr 2. Fine and very warm has been all week. Auntie cleaned Pantry and Kitchen Cupboards,

Sun Apr 3. Fine but cooler. I put on lighter Undervest yesterday. Uncle, Aunt Mattie and I at Church. Willies all here for tea.

Mon Apr 4. Rained in morning and cleared about ten {Between lines it reads: Mick Started to harrow} O'clock. Auntie Started to wash then. Mick started work. Uncle in Toronto, Aunt Mattie and I looking for Duck eggs,

Tue Apr 5. Fine and very, very hot. Aunt Mattie and I walked to Thornhill. Auntie Collecting Missionary. money. we had tea at Mothers Uncle came for us.

Wed Apr 6. Fine day colder. Our teams both out on land. Aunt Mattie and I after Duck eggs again.

Thur Apr 7. Fine but very cold and dreadful wind. Ice this morning. Aunties at W.A. Meeting. they got {Above it reads: cold}

Fri Apr 8. Cold and a heavy frost.

Sat Apr 9. Fine and moderately cold. I took a Setting of eggs to Mr. Devlins. I walked out for hat enamel. had dinner at Mothers and Annie came out for tea.

Sun Apr 10. Fine but windy and cold. Uncle, Aunt Mattie and I at church, Mrs and Mr Breaky here for tea. Our parlor fire light. Leigh Page died.

Mon Apr 11. Rained and Snowed a little in afternoon We washed and churned.

Tue Apr 12. Fine bright day. frosty and thick ice. Aunt Mattie and I in Toronto with Mother and Annie.

Wed Apr 13. Fine bright day. Uncle at Mr Brillingers funeral. I called to see Annie Teasdale. Aunt Mattie and I walked to Price Evans for Duck eggs but Saw no one. first calf.

Thur Apr 14. Fine and much warmer, have had a week of cold weather. I called at Mary's. Auntie Mattie called at Mrs Clarkes.

Fri Apr 15. Fine day but windy. Uncle helping Henry Bowes he is moving his barn.

Sat Apr 16. Find but cold east wind. Men finished seeding all but peas.

Sun Apr 17. Rained measly all day at intervals. We did not go to Church.

Mon Apr 18. Rained a little in the morning and very foggy.

Tue Apr 19. Raining heavily from the North East. Tom Farr came in the afternoon to remain.

Wed Apr 20. Fine untill evening, a little showery. We washed. Uncle and Tom Farr at Mr Bothams. Willies children here for tea.

Thur Apr 21. Fine and bright. Tom left in the morning. We cleaned the Dining Room. and did up the curtains in the afternoon.

Fri Apr 21. Fine day. Aunt Mattie called to see Annie Teasdale in the afternoon.

Sat Apr 23. Rained in the morning then cleared when we went to the Car. Aunt Mattie and I went to Toronto. I went to Dentist. \$2.00. Then Auntie and I went to Eatons to get hats. Mine \$3.40 went to Alices to remain. rained heavily in eve.

Sun Apr 24. Rained at first and cleared about ten O'clock. Aunt Mattie and I at church of Redeemer. in the evening we went to St Pauls.

Mon Apr 25. Rained and paused in the morning. then cleared and a beautiful afternoon. We took a walk to Rosedale and I called to see Aunt Nancy. We came home on the 7:30 Car. Another calf. It started to rain at nine O'clock again.

Tue Apr 26. Rained and poured a regular flood all over early in the morning. Our men took Pork to Willies to be Smoked. Mrs Clarkes children all have measels

Wed Apr 27. Fine but a little dull cleared a little and dried. We washed and churned. Maggie Snider married

Thur Apr 28. {Below it reads: F} Fine but cold a little Ice this morning. Uncle and Aunt Mattie at Thornhill in the evening. Mr Banks here for apples. two Barrells of Spies and few Greenings. Mother paid for Lard. 20 cts per pound.

Fri Apr 29. Rained heavily from the East all day everything Soaked. Willie called in the morning for a while.

Sat Apr 30. Fine and clearing. Uncle went to Toronto Lizzie came out for tea and rode home with Mick in the evening.

Sun May 1. Cold East wind. Uncle and I at Church. rained guite heavily in the afternoon.

Mon May 2. Rained and poured all afternoon everything Standing in pools of water.

Tue May 3. Fine but dull. Uncle took Aunt Nellie to the Car. she went to W.A. Annual. Uncle and I went to to see Annie Teasdale.

Wed May 4. Fine and bright but cold. a little ice. Uncle and Mick at Mr Teasdale for shingles. Auntie called to See old Mrs Bone. Annie walked out in the afternoon.

Thur May 5. Fine but cold. Annie and I called at Willies in the afternoon. Mother there. I got eggs at {Above it reads: Mr Devlins and hen at Willies.}

Fri May 6. Fine day. Our men finished cutting down the old apple tree. I called at Willies in the evening. The King died.

Sat May 7. Fine bright and much warmer. Uncle at Albert Hornes funeral. Mr Teasdale called.

Sun May 8. Fine with the exception of a little Shower. It is nice and warm. We went to Mrs Bowens funeral. Willie and Mary here for tea.

Mon May 9. Fine day turning colder again. I went to help Mrs Teasdale they are laying foundation of barn. Marjorie here for tea. On the land first.

Tue May 10. Fine with the exception of a little shower. {Between lines it reads: Sowed Some Peas.}
Aunt Nellie came home. We Set Duck eggs

Wed May 11. Fine day but cool. I went to Lydia Wilsons. Miss Johnson and Annie and Lizzie came out in the evening.

Thur May 12. Fine but cold. a white frost. We have four chicks

Fri May 13. Cold and dull all day. Charlie and Grant here for tea.

Sat May 14. Fine and cool. Charlie and Grant here for tea. I went to Mrs Tom Bowes to trade eggs.

Sun May 15. Fine bright day and warmer. Whit Sunday Willie and the boys here for tea. Aunt Nellie at Willies in the evening. I called at Mr Teasdales. Annie is much worse. Ice. Uncle, Aunt Mattie and I at Church.

Mon May 16. Fine and warm, Moved our Range out at noon. Willie helped us.

Tue May 17. Fine and warm. Men put in Roots. We put in beans and Some cucumbers. I was at Miss Phillips in afternoon.

Wed May 18. Rained last night then cleared and much colder. very high wind. Aunt Nellie called to ask for Annie Teasdale.

Thur May 19. A white frost then came out warm. Put Bacon away. I called to ask for Annie Teasdale.

Fri May 20. Fine and warmer in the evening it rained heavily. King buried. Aunt Nellie at Memorial Service.

Sat May 21. Fine and very Sultry and warm. Sat out on Verandah for first, in afternoon. called to ask for Annie Teasdale and Mrs Bowes.

Sun May 22. Fine with exception of a few sprinkles. Uncle, Aunt Nellie and I at Church. We were all at Willies for tea. The Foresters had a Sermon at our church.

Mon May 23. Rained heavily in the afternoon. I called to ask for Annie Teasdale. Our men finished the Peas. Lettuice for tea. for first time.

Tue May 24. {Below it reads: I weigh <u>136 pounds} Empire Day</u>. We all spent the day at Mothers Went up to Richmond Hill Fair in the afternoon. Is a beautiful day.

Wed May 25. Colder and windy. Uncle and I at Thorn Hill. I called at Miss Mundeys. Uncle in Toronto in the afternoon. Mick {Between lines it reads: Put in Tomato Plants.} planting his garden. Halleys Comet.

Thur May 26. Fine but cold and windy. a Slight frost this morning. Our men planted the Potatoes. I called to ask for Annie Teasdale.

Fri May 27. Fine day very cool. Mr Teasdale and the boys here in the evening. Aunt Mattie called at Mrs Clarkes.

Sat May 28. Fine and warm Sitting out on the Verandah. Uncle in Toronto. Aunt Nellie called at Mr Teasdales. Uncle Shot a Skunk in the evening.

Sun May 29. A dull morning. Uncle, Aunt Mattie and I at church. it came a shower in the evening.

Mon May 30. Dull and a few showers. The men started in the barn. yard. Annie, Lizzie, and Miss Beatty came for tea.

Tue May 31. Cold and windy. a few sprinkles in the morning I called at Mary's. Aunties at the Dutch Cemetry. Charlie Teasdale called in the afternoon. Mr Teasdale and Frank in the evening. Marjorie came to stay all night. Jim Wise helping men.

Wed June 1. Cold and dull, coming a few sprinkles. C.S.married

Thur June 2. Fine day, I called at Mr Teasdales. Aunt Nellie at W.A. meeting at Mrs Gibsons.

Fri June 3. Cold and dull. we were at home.

Sat June 4. Fine bright day. I went to Toronto. called at, Aunt Lizzies. I had tea at Mothers.

Sun June 5. Rained from the East all day. Mr and Mrs Reive here for the day.

Mon June 6. Fine day. I called to see Annie Teasdale Men finished the farm yard.

Tue June 7. Fine day Aunt Mattie went to Aunt Lizzies Uncle and I took her out. and took the butter it is only 17 cents.

Sat June 18. Fine but warm. Jennie Green went home in the evening. I went to Mr Teasdale in eve.

Sun Dec 17. Fine day. We started to go to church at night but got shaft broken. we came back roads badly cut.

Mon Dec 18. Fine day moderately cold. washed and churned. Uncle and Auntie at Thornhill in the afternoon. Annie and Lizzie here for tea.

Tue Dec 19. Fine day and mild. roads very badly cut up.

Wed Dec 20. A beautiful day frozen clean. roads very rough. Sold Turkey hens - 19 lbs 20 cts -- 3.80 Uncle, Aunt Nellie and I at the Presbyterian Xmas tree.

Thur Dec 21. A colder East wind a little sleet but not such a bad day. Willies butchering. home by 3 o'clock.

Fri Dec 22. Mild and foggy. started to rain in afternoon Uncle Aunt Mattie and I went to decorate. Uncle went to Richmond Hill.

Sat Dec 23. Fine and mild. fresh buds on Black Currant bush. Uncle in Toronto.

Sun Dec 24. Fine and very mild. Uncle, Aunt Nellie and I at church. at home the rest of the day.

Mon Dec 25. Fine and very mild. Christmas. foggy. I walked out to Thornhill. We all spent the day at Mothers.

Tue Dec 26. Fine day and mild. Uncle at Woodbridge. We killed turkey 16 and chickens picked them without a fire in back Kitchen.

Wed Dec 27. Fine but colder and high wind. Aunt Nellie went to Toronto. Uncle at Willies.

Thur Dec 28. Decidedly colder. high wind <u>light coal feeder.</u> Aunt Nellie came home. Uncle, Aunt Mattie and I at Mr Teasdales in the evening. I put on Winter Gurnsey.

Fri Dec 29. Fine and cold. The Teasdales here to spend the evening. fine but wind settled.

Sat Dec 30. Cold East wind. Started to snow about six o'clock.

Sun Dec 31. Rained and snowed till the middle of the afternoon, quite mild then at dark turned cold and windy. Started to wash in house.
