I went down town this morning to ship Mrs. W. eggs to her and get some meat for dinner. I went to bank to renew the Mrs. Marshall's sale note which due tomorrow and Freeman asked me if I would borrow any more so I said if he had no I would take another hundred for a couple of notes. He said "I'll let you have all you want prospects are useful anyway. I was late getting home dinner but Mary couldn't have it till I came as meat but forgot to get bread so had to go over to Mrs. and borrow a loaf. I spent the after noon making on shutters to enclose the porch. Ina was here to she intends going to Jim's to tomorrow so I home after tea and went on down to land, very high and cold gale from north west all day to little to night and cold.
