

all James Cameron Island Nov 15th 1871

high East Wind a great many Boats coming up as the canal is likely to be forced now. The Corinthian Kingston Spartan Osprey and Propeller America a Race Both together. The Magnet St Helen the Rector Went Down another Propeller went up and another Tow went up keeping in the houses this week Back feeding with good Hay high Wind to night Rainy 16th ^{Then} ^{Reparing} Day Wind cutting hay Put in Roses Old Sheep again keeping in the pens a small Tug went up with a Tow a very raw kind of weather 17th A fine Day the Man to be hung in Montreal to day for the Murder of Mrs Foster his name.

Went to Fish Eggs got 3 West Wind I came some cold towards evening set 3 traps in the front Marsh Fishing springs to some of my traps to night 18th Went to a Baker to get 125 cents Bond salt to cut Tobacco got 2 papers from Andrew found a right line near Hamiltons Island with a horse sh. and a boat clattered on it I think it must belong to old Tom Davis as that superstitious bigging is George Keushaw went to Lancaster Great Shootin over the way of Chusters Island I think it must be Sam Hopkins with decoys there seen a great many wild geese to night and last night I never seen such blocks of flocks as went down an immense lot of them 13th Sunday East Wind some cold a good many boats a going 20th Went to Chusters to fish eggs in the mud and heard great Blowing of Horns to night down to the Kit Kit Island all day and only got a lizard not 1 egg and in the best of luck to get them 21st On this day of the month Donaldell Lancaster departed in 1846 drew some wood drew up 2 of the canoes took the boards from the sugar bush came home for the gun thought i seen wild geese in the Bay but they were big black ducks 22nd hopping at the door keeping in the horses lot or boats a going the ottawa city went into Lancaster of propeller of propeller to the dock houses took out the barrel stove to the cook house took in the cook stove to the house

all 23rd (Aller's Island) Nov 23, 1871 This is Thanksgiving Day in the States shot a duck at the lower end of the island forcing a fence around the stacks as the cattle is at them pretty cold to day the Interprize went in to salmon River and came out to night as it is freezing over hard to night a circle around the moon East Wind put our sheep in the shed shut them up feeding them Barges towed up by the Highlander went in today to Lancaster lot of boats coming up and going down owing and going 24th chopping stove wood cold time 25th then came up in a boat stolt on the Sturgeon Island thought it was Sam Hopkins Horses got out by the rim running out of the stable door got them in a cold night 26th Fine day commenced to rain and wind stormy to night 27th Took the long canoe from the lower Point cold north wind 28th Tow boats and propellers going yet Walter Baker and George Bosell after their houses not pleased at me feeding hay and keeping them in got 2 dollars and 65 cents from George and I paid on all a dollar for the horses Highlander up to night with a big sow Europe went up cut some wood for the fire for cold to night 29th a small propeller went down with something like a dredge in tow John A. McDonald went up with a schooner in tow light in the light houses to night and its very windy cold and very frosty to night chopping stove wood broke on the rules of wood before the door feeding and keeping in the cattle this is St Andrews Eve a ball at McRae's at the depot the big white owl coming around and Andrew's gun 30th St Andrews Day very cold high wind frosty ground hard no snow froze to the outside of the bushes last night could not see any light in any of the light houses 1st of December a tug propeller went up nothing in tow very cold and windy cutting stove wood and pelting in the cook house water comming to raise 2nd taking up the boat and canoes raising the pine stock and it rolled over after having it high enough killed a sheep a very good one she is still alive keeping the hay and bull kicking but set fire to the back marsh it dont burn well south west wind
