- Tue Jan 2. A very bright day. Aggie went to school. We washed and churned. Mr and Mrs Crane called. also Mr W. Hinwill. Uncle and Aunt Nellie called on Mrs Morgan.
- Wed Jan 3. Fine day with. Uncle in Toronto. Auntie called on for Brimston. Mrs Pickett and Mrs Little.
- Thu Jan 4. Fine but cold. Aunt Nellie at Mrs Bealings "W. W." lunch took her out and went for tea.
- Fri Jan 5. Fine but extremely cold. and high wind. Mrs Morgan Little and Miller here for tea.
- Sat Jan 6. Fine but very cold. 14 below zero and snow in places. I went to Toronto walked to see but lunch went.
- Sun Jan 7. Very very cold and high wind. we did not go to church as it is so cold.
- Mon Jan 8. Father's birthday then started to snow about three o'clock. We took our horse to the barn. Soft water pump froze.
- Tue Jan 9. A very stormy day blowing all day. Uncle, Aunt Nellie and I went to Weston took rather but poor sleeping. I remained others got home about twelve. could not get up the land.

Dec Jan 29. Rather stormy raining and freezing. Inck at Thornhill
in the afternoon.

Jan 30. Fine day. Mr. Ligon called. Frank & Mrs. Sandels, Charles here.
Wed Jan 31. Fine and moderately cold.

Thurs Feb 1. Fine and mild. Annie at 10 a. meeting. Inck took them
and drove out to meet them. No little here for milk.
I let the Range out the first time this year.

Sat Feb 25 Fine and very mild. The roads slippery and snow nearly

Wed Apr 2 Fine but cold. Uncle and Aunt Nellie at Mr McDonalds with butter and eggs.

Wed Apr 3 Fine but cold wind not thawing much. I called at Nellie. Uncle and Aunt Nellie at Mr Walshs Progressors Lecture.

- Sun Apr 14 Raining most of the day. Uncle and Aunt Nellie at Church. a damp East wind. fogged out again.
- Mon Apr 15 A heavy thunder storm last night. fine and warm started to wind out. roads getting dry. washed and chimneys as usual. struck an Oakley and over a thousand finished. 1600

Coldest In 17 Years.

"This is the coldest day for seventeen years," said the Weather Man at the Star this morning. "The last time the mercury dropped so low was in 1895, when it a degree was registered. This winter, too, holds the record for cold, last month's average temperature of 25.5 degrees above having been only once broken, and that was last a century ago, in 1811, when January averaged one degree colder. Last night was also the coldest night this winter, the coldest day being on January 19th, when the mercury went down to 11.1°.

The probabilities are "Fair and very cold to-day and to-morrow, with light west winds."
