Sun Jan 1. Fine day. Mother and the girls also Willies family here to spend the day. A cold west wind but fine. Lucy remained at home. One bright day Lucy went to Willow. We washed and cleaned. Mr and Mrs Bond called. also Mr. McMillan. Uncle and Aunt Nellie called in the evening.

Mon Jan 2. Fine day cold. Walked in Town. Auntie called on Mr. Granger, Miss Fickett, and Mr. Little.

Tuesday. Fine but cold. Aunt Nellie at Mrs. Beckers 11.00. Uncle took her out and went for tea.

Wednesday. Fine but extremely cold and high wind. Mr. Granger, Little and Willow here for tea.

Thursday. Fine but very cold. 14 below zero and snow on place. I went to Town walked to the last bush west.

Friday. Very very cold and high wind we did not go to church as it is so cold.

Saturday. Father's birthday then started to snow about three o'clock we took our horses to the barn. Soft water pump froze.

Sunday. A very stormy day. Snowing all day. Uncle and Willow and I went to Weston took extra hot poor sleeping. I remained others got home about twelve. could not get up the horses.

Mon Jan 28. Rather stormy raining and freezing. Uncle at Thornhill  
in the afternoon.

Tues Jan 29. Fine day. Mr. Brown called. Frank & Mrs. Standish, Charles here.  
Not much. Fine and moderately cold.

Thur Feb 1. Fine and mild. Auntie at W. a. meeting. Uncle took her  
and drove out to meet them. Very little here for mill.  
Saw the Parrot out the first time this year.

Fri Feb 2. Fine but cold, and bright. The Bear could see its  
shadow. Flushing at night.

Sat Feb 3. Fine but very, very cold. Below zero. Grand daughter  
here to spend the day. I went to town to the Market.  
Stayed at Esther's for tea.

Sun Feb 4. Fine but very, very cold. Uncle and Aunt Martha  
at church. Uncle and I at Concord church.

Mon Feb 5. Fine but very cold. Aunt Nelly at Thornhill. Uncle at home.

Tues Feb 6. Fine and a little milder. I went to town. Uncle  
remained at home over night.

Wed Feb 7. Rather blustery than cloudy. I came home early.

Thur Feb 8. Fine but cold. Aunt here all day. Uncle took her  
and I to Thornhill, got my cap, and finished it

Fri Feb 20. Fine and very mild. Uncle in town. We had a few  
hours to play with Annie here all night. Got mother  
eggs, were nearly all gone on cedarwood.

Sat Feb 21. Fine and mild. Annie went home. Uncle got Register,  
Wed Feb. Very stormy at last wind all day. Blowing and snowing.  
Sun Feb 22. A dreadful west storm. Roads all filled up  
soaring him up we could not go to Willa.

Sun Feb 22. One day. Uncle made our road through the orchard.  
We all went to Willa for tea.

Sat Feb 23. Fine and very mild. The roads slippery and snow ready  
all gone on it. Margie here for tea. Uncle took me  
to the Park ice a little soft. we got three eggs

Sun Feb 24. Fine and very mild. Uncle, Aunt Nellie and I at  
church. Jack and Aunt Mattie at evening church.

Mon Feb 25. A very stormy day at times an east wind. we washed  
and cleaned. Mr Campbell and Mr Under here for dinner.

Tue Feb 26. A stormy day with west wind. Mr Campbell here for  
tea. church in the evening.

Wed Feb 27. Uncle and Aunt Mattie went to town. Auntie  
remained. Still getting three eggs.

Feb 10th. Fine but cold. Mr Scholfield died. Uncle at Willies, then  
came home and went to Thornhill to see about grave. -  
Very fine day and moderately cold. Mr & Mrs Ferguson called. We went  
but were fine but cold. Uncle at Mr Scholfields funeral. I  
did not go to the Bank.

Canadas fine but cold and wind. Willie here for dinner.

I went to Fisherville. We were at Willie for tea.

Very fine. Fine but cold and wind. I went to the Bank with Willie  
Mr Campbell here.

Very fine. Fine but cold but wind. No cold at Mandeville.  
Uncle in town.

Wed morn. Fine but moderately cold. Uncle helping Willie in the  
morning. Mr Campbell here. Dad is sick. I went to  
see Jubilee Long and with Willie and Mary.

Thurs morn. Fine day and middle. Snow nearly all gone on the  
road. Uncle at 7 A.M. Uncle went to meet her. Dick called  
Fri morn. Fine with exception of light snow flurries. Uncle  
helping Willie in the afternoon.

Sat morn. Fine but colder again. Uncle at shop in the afternoon.

Sun Mar 1 Sun but cold. Marge went to church with Uncle and  
Auntie. Willie all here for tea.

Mon Mar 2 One day and moderately cold.

Tue Mar 3 Came a little snow then fine. And Mother came  
home. Mr and Mrs Henniff here.

Wed Mar 4 Fine and mild. Uncle helping Willie take log out.  
Then very fine and very cold we sleighing on the road.  
I called at Mr Smidts. Uncle and I drove to  
the store at night.

Thu Mar 5 Sporing and blowing from the east fell about  
six feet of soft snow. a beautiful day.

Fri Mar 6 Fine day the snow very deep.

Sat Mar 7 Saturday day Uncle, Auntie and I at  
evening church very cold snow nearly gone.

Sun Mar 8 One bright warm day dreadfully slippery. we  
walked and skinned Mr and Mrs Smidts Mr  
and Mrs Johnson here in the evening.

Mon Mar 9 Fine and warm, walk over the road. Uncle in  
town. Auntie went to Mrs Mondays.

I went out in the evening got a little damp.

and Ned home. Fine but turning quite cold all day at night.  
Uncle and I at Frank's Reservoir, and Clara, Fredrik  
returned with us.

Thurs. Dec. Rather a rough day on road over snow covered  
in the afternoon. We took Clara away in evening  
In many places but cold the sleighing a little better.

Fri. Dec. 26, Fine, and cold enough at night, and at the mill down ~~to~~  
~~we have a very bad deck. I think it~~  
down more fine and cold. Uncle and I at church. The children  
had all day Uncle and Aunt Mattie at Wallie's in the  
noon dark, fine and moderately cold. Mr Brown started to dig the  
lawn, it is very icy and deep. Uncle went to order a  
car at the station.

Sat. Dec. Fine at first then came some soft snow. I went to  
Denton walked out and home. Auntie called to me  
Mrs White. I called in to ask for Mrs Black.  
Wed. Dec. Fine and cold. Uncle and I at Thornhill in the  
afternoon Annie came home with us. and Uncle  
took Annie home in the buggy the first time  
out. snow nearly gone on the road but big drifts  
on top of roads.

Cloudy fine and very mild. Ranch in town. water over the road again but I could get on alright.

Saturday fine day quite cold. water high. our people taking wheat to the car. Mr. Brown finished here at noon. Sat down fine but a little colder. They finished filling the car. Mr. McDonald has come to Shambell. Roads dry in some places. water still over the road. the skating fairly good at the lake.

Sunday Fine a little show at noon. Uncle and Aunt Nellie at church. Sophie came home with them and Uncle took her home in the evening. I have a cold.

Monday April 1st. bad wind and cold. we washed and threshed. washed some for cleaning. Rained in the afternoon about 18 inches let fall out.

Tuesday Fine but cold. wind not blowing much. I called at Nellie's. Uncle and Aunt Nellie at Mr. McDonald's with butter and eggs.

Wednesday Fine but cold wind not blowing much. I called at Nellie's. Uncle and Aunt Nellie at Mr. McDonald's Progress Books.

Thur Apr 4. Milder with a few squalls. Uncle took Auntie to the meeting.

Fri Apr 5. Good Friday. fine and very mild. Taking snow water over the roads. Robins and Blackbirds. Willie faintly here for tea. Water cold.

Sat Apr 6. Fine and very mild. Walked down the ditch now.  
~~Drop an ant~~  
He set a hen. Dined at the Coast. Took pipes down.

Sun Apr 7. Easter Sunday. Rained heavily until noon. We did not go to church. Uncle, Aunt Willie and I all drew blankets for tea.

Mon Apr 8. Fine but cold. Easter Monday. Dined at the Victory meeting.

Tue Apr 9. Rained with snow several inches. very soft. Roads in town. roads very bad.

Wed Apr 10. Fine but very wet and muddy. We cleaned the chamber. Willie came to help carry coal fade out.

Thur Apr 11. Rained heavily in the morning, the sun went to Corato fine and bright in the afternoon. I got my hat \$4.

I called to see Miss Duncan in the evening.  
Sun Apr 8 Fine day made bed. Painted white-washed ceiling  
and we cleaned & spack room, and cleaned feather bed.  
Sat Apr 10. Fine but cold East wind. Uncle at the meat funeral.  
he brought Mother out for the roads a little dry.  
Sun Apr 11. Raining most of the day. Uncle and Aunt Nellie  
at church. a damp tail wind. fog out again.  
Mon Apr 12 A heavy thunder storm last night. fine and warm  
stamps to wash out.  
roads getting dry. washed and cleaned a few  
struts in Sabay and over a thousand 1600  
Dow Apr 13. Fine and warm. We cleaned Uncle's room and  
ours. did not take carpets up.  
Wed Apr 14. Fine but cold East wind. Harold Parkinson  
here. the soft water pump sprung. Threw out  
Chapel Parlor and Spare room.  
Thur Apr 15. Fine but dull and showery. Uncle in town. Auntie  
cleaned Pantry. We called at Mrs Whittle.  
Fri Apr 16. Fine but cold. also very high wind.  
Sat Apr 17. Fine bright and warm. Auntie finished collecting  
at Thornhill. Uncle & she had tea at mother's. Come  
home at I went a few. Baked & cleaned orchard.  
lettuce and onions in, all that is dry. road dry.

to bed.

Coldest In 17 Years.

"This is the coldest day for seventeen years," said Mr. Wm. MacLean, The Star reporter. "The last time we were so severely chilled, it was last winter, when a blizzard was experienced. This winter, says Mr. MacLean, the mean daily minimum average temperature of 19.5 degrees below zero has been only once broken, and that only half a century ago, in 1881, when January averaged one degree colder. Some nights were then the coldest nights this century, the cold weather having set in January 1880, when the mercury went down to 14.1."

The meteorologist adds: "From next week to the end of the month, with high pressure, there will be





10th July. Fine and cool. Edward helping Willie over  
mow at the hay.

Thur July 8. Fine day, we people hauling hay, we picked cherries and canned some. came a thunder storm in the afternoon.

Fine and cool went picking berries only got two quarts when preserved. Inside in front too wet to draw in. Mack cutting the last. I went to Miss Duncans got groceries 3 qt's of pt when preserved

Mon July 12. Fine and cool men hauling. Aunt M. Maggie and I at picking at Mr. Elkins. Tom's came for us.

Tues July 13. A little showery then cleared. Edward helping me with picking peaches at Mrs. Blashaw.

- Sun July 25. Fine and warm, our people starting.  
Sun July 26. Fine and cool our men finished haying. Dick  
went home at night to do his garden.
- Sat July 27. Fine and cool Uncle at Mr Little. Edward at  
Mr Brangos helping. I went to Weston in the

did not come at noon.

Tue Aug 20. Rained a little then cleared, cut a little.

Wed Aug 21. Rained a little, then cleared, started to cut  
oats at 4 o'clock. Willie & Mercie here for tea

Fri Aug 28. A little shower at first then cleared until evening a thunder storm. I took Sam out to 3 others. Also Franklin did.

Sat Aug 29. Fine but very sultry. We camped here for dinner. Mushrooms for tea. finished cutting

Sat Aug 29. Showery all day. Tom and Auntie at Alice funeral.

Sun Aug 30. Very warm and sultry we were at Willis for tea. at Lickerville in the evening.

Sun Aug 30. Rained last night. Nick came at noon. Took at the Es. a dreadful storm at 5 o'clock.

Mon Aug 31. A fine cool day but too wet to haul in. Mon Aug 31. Showering in the afternoon. W. Boar bought 4 ears of chittern 37 lb at 15¢ lb \$0.55.

Tue Sept 10. ~~Wells~~ Fine but very very warm. Aunt Nella in Toronto. men at Willis.

Wed Sept 11. A little shower soon ceased. Started to hand at noon at Willis. came home at 5 o'clock.

Thur Sept 12. Fine day and moderately warm. the men all here, laundry, the Ross boys here. Some time for the laundry today.

Fri Sept 13. Fine day I went to Toronto at noon, the men all here finished laundry and started oats.

Sat Sept 14. Dull with a little shower. men here they finished all but ratings. Auntie and I went to gardeners and got Tomatoes 30 lbs.

Sun Sept 15. Raining nearly all day. we were bound.

Mon Sept 16. Fine day but dull at first.

Sat Sept 17. Fine but no rain. Aunt Mattie at Nocton and  
Uncle took us to gardens  
which had last night all very muddy.

Mon Sept 18. A shower then fine and bright we are  
threshing, came a shower just as they finished  
so Sept 19. Fine day Willies are threshing.

Tue Sept 20. Fine but damp east wind. Mr Gibson called.

Wed Sept 21. East wind Uncle, Aunt Mattie and I at Church,  
Willies fairly all here so too, started to rain  
in the afternoon poured at night.

Thur Sept 22. Fine but damp east wind, bundle in front,

Fri Sept 23. Hail rain from the east,

Sat Sept 24. Fine and warm. Aunt Mattie and I in Grimsby  
got town suit \$14. and hat \$6. I came home  
Auntie remained. Mrs Goodale had for tea, struck  
and sift her in the evening, everything very damp.  
Sun Sept 25. Rained a little then cleared. Uncle at no Black  
threshing in the afternoon.

Mon Sept 26. Fine and clear. See this morning Uncle and  
Aunt Nellie at Garville in the evening.

Sat Sept 28. Dull and sparkling. Aunt Matilda came home, Uncle in town and Dick sent home in the afternoon. Started to rain heavily in the evening and poured all night.

Sun Sept 29. Fine and cooler with strong wind Uncle and Auntie at McRae's, &c.

Mon Sept 30. Strong wind with squalls washed things for cleaning then cleaned man's room.

Tue Oct 1. Fine day, cleaned upstairs and took up full carpet. Aunt Nellie called at Mrs Gaudales and Miss Dawson.

Wed Oct 2. Fine and warmer, cleaned chamber, then Auntie and I went to decorate, men hauling wheat at Willis.

Thurs Oct 3. Fine but colder men finished Willis wheat Uncle, Aunt Matilda and I at Thanksgiving.

Fri Oct 4. Fine warm day men finished pulling Willis pea and started over Uncle & Willis at Jim McEwens funeral.

We cleaned Parlor and spare bed room the Dining Room.
