

June 26<sup>th</sup> 1892.

Sun, 26, fine cool morning, clouding  
over about 11. A.M. it suddenly  
commenced raining and partly  
Hail, as if a cloud had burst.  
continuing about an hour  
Attended Church and S. School  
spent the day at Mrs Rawans  
and enjoyed myself very  
much

Mon, 27.  
Rain bore witness from  
Point E. to South and fine  
remained very brilliant for long.

Dull and cloudy, commenced  
raining quite early in the  
morning continuing all day  
accompanied with Thunder  
in the afternoon and evening.  
The afternoon's rain was some-  
thing remarkable almost a  
deluge everywhere, one report  
of Thunder was terrific  
unprecedented in my time  
The rain-Bow this evening was just  
grand, the most beautiful I ever saw.

June 28<sup>th</sup> 1892.

Tue 28. Very cool today, partly cloudy  
with high S. West wind, quite  
cold to night

Wed 29. Fine in the morning, with frequent  
showers during the day  
accompanied with Thunder. A  
fine cool evening.

Thu 30. Rained all the forenoon very  
hard, coming down in torrents  
the whole while, clearing off  
at noon and very fine the  
remainder of the day.  
Was at Mrs Lovorn, and  
met Mrs Mrs Harding, Mrs John  
Harding, Mrs Grace & daughter  
busied ourselves picking  
Sharon Berries, for Mrs Cowan  
altogether spent a pleasant  
evening
