4 Fine sunny warm day. We got 2 more anchor posts in creek fence filled with stones. Mr Mackie over in morning got some seed corn. Willie drove down for Mary AM he got harness mended at W orders 35c paid Ab Landrum living 2.50 paid Kiel flourist \$7.00 for weather degree on RB stamp 25c got cabbage from him 15c. Mary got warts at Gwings yesterday \$10.50. Willie drove down at night for Mary who walked down PM also brought up mother to stay all night.
