 J. Johnston helped us in with the chaff we ^{set} ^{up} ^{the} ^{threshing} ^{mill}
- 18 cleaned up the Barn floor in the forenoon Henry plowed
 in the afternoon I went to agriculture meeting at the
 Station in the afternoon heavy rain towards evening
 rain the Rev. Mr. Dunlap preached this morning heavy rain
 all night & day no meeting ^{at night} the minister did not ^{come}
- 19 heavy rain last night & most of the day with wind from
 rain the northeast had the cows in the stable most of the
- 20 cleaned out the old well it most full this morning
 21 Hired some wood put the stove in last night
- 22 drew of some large stones that is in the ground on the
 Bull or horse pasture before we began to ^{plow} ^{potatoes}
- 23 cleaned 3 bushel of wheat 4 1/2 bushel of peas
 & went to Escott mill the peas is to feed the cow
- 24 Henry plowed in the horse pasture the stable
 feed is low wet the ground is in a surrow
- 25 finished digging the potatoes & drew in them
 we had dug the bin is as full as it will hold
- 26 the Rev. Mr. Selong preached this morning & the
 rain Rev. Mr. Dunlap in the evening little rain
- 27 Henry plowed in the horse pasture part of the
 rain day a good deal of rain I mended Elms boat
 28 plowed & drew of some I mended my ^{boat} ^{awn}
- first snow 29 snowed about 2 inches last night plowed some
 snow rained & snowed some Mr. Begg inspected the ^{School}
- 30 Henry finished plowing the horse pasture in the
 fore went to the plowing match very few
