

July 11th / 1843.

Tue. 11. Most beautiful day, partly cloudy
clouds looking like rain but sun
and fine visitors. Misses Milton's
& Bureau at Mr. Cowan's. They
spent the most of the day here at
the factory to see the ~~process~~
process of Fine making Mrs
Ash (who is stopping at Mr. Cowan's)
Accompanied them here and
remained with them, until
the whole performance was compl-
eted. Mr. D. Swan of Ganarogue
was also at Mr. Cowan's on business
of great importance which
necessitated my presence so
with us, and after accompanying
him (Mr. Cowan) to Mr. Art. Smith's.
To get his signature to the paper,
returning stopped at Mr. Cowan's, he
having a lunch prepared for us
he prevailed on me to go to see him -
at Ganarogue

July 12th / 1843.

Wed 12. Glorious fluctuation of July, but rain-
ing slow and since seven o'clock
having the appearance of all day
rain, but clearing off partly at
noon but resumed its work
again this morning at the afternoon.
Dork at night, Mr. Cowan went
to see a sack flown at Mr. Bann-
sick of the flour was fifteen
inches across it, a factus.
Thu 13. Cloudy this morning but clearing
off and becoming fine and
mild, but some appearance
rain again in the afternoon but
failed to come. At Mr. Harding
tonight and accompanied
Mr. Cowan & Mr. Ash home.
Fri 14. Cloudy this morning but clearing
off and remaining fine but
very hot close this evening
