

JAMES CAMERON Island 6th July 1901

Rained this Morning East Wind I he Dredge to 6 lbs of Butter 120 lbs of Eggs 72. 6.4 cents paid all up to Day Leander to Summerstown very hot took over the Rest of the Hens Leander for the Mail got a Letter from the Kansas City Journal to Renew my Paper that I will do the first of the week Bought 4 lbs of Sugar the Lady Smith went down with a Big Party on Board near the Lancaster Lighthouse they turned back the Dredge Moved to Hamiltons Wharf Rained to night 7th Sunday Rain fine Rained again wind Thunder lightning Lovinia and Stanley went to George's Fernandez came with 3 stripes on his coat Sargent from 3 Rivers one of the Sheep Dead rain hard to night Precious Blood of our Lord 8th Fine East Wind Stanley and Tonia came wrote a letter to the Kansas City Journal with 25 cents in it postage Paid not registered to go off tomorrow 2 cents postage Fernandez crossed dug out some stones on the Path to the River the Mr and Miss Websters here to 2 1/2 lbs of Butter 50 cents fished a little got 4 lots of Eel flies Fish dont bite very extra fine night 9th a very fine very warm day Fernandez Went to Lancaster Dredged up 2 logs out of the water on the Pitt Point one of the Big Sea Boats went up a boat sounding the depth where they were dredging 4 of the Websters fishing and enjoying the fine day on the water Stanley made 1/2 cords this evening Leander crossed working at the Mowing Machine that broke cut some in the grove 10th Unfortunate day rain fine cloudy Mr Jessimas Steamer Gracie fishing around came for Baits working at the Mower putting it together Fernandez came had Juppers Picture in a frame 75 cents

JAMES CAMERON Island 11th July 1901

Ed Renshaw here got 1 Doz of Eggs for dredge 84 paid this East Wind fine day first Mowing with the Mower Machine and it will not work taking it apart to go to the Blacksmith with it Fernandez went to Cornwall Took some of my Books over from the other house went to the Lower Point 12th July ORANGE MAN'S DAY a very fine day East Wind Warm Peter Back here to 2 lbs of Butter 40 Mowing with the Scythe at south side near shore up next Marsh and east of the Wheat Field some fires up near the Bay the Orange men has a very fine Day for their Walk Fernandez came 13th a very fine day very warm East Wind Mowing around above the Lane to the front of the Barn Napoleon here to dinner Working the new Rake for the first 3 ladies for Butter got 4 lbs 80 one of them a Miss Mrs May Leander to Summerstown Bought Making wooden EEL SPEAR prongs to fish to night (got ice) the Miss Websters to 4 Doz of Eggs 1 lb of Butter cream & 78 cents 14th very fine 2 Boys crossed to night got 4 fish last night 15th St Silvester's Day West Wind a very hot day fine breeze Ed Renshaw here got 1 Doz of Eggs for the dredge 1.32 Stanley went with Eddy took a rope Leander and Fernandez Mowing at the Stony Hill very warm my letter goes off to day to Toronto to J. G. Mussell Toronto Junction Ont A fortunate day the 15th Eddy and Stanley took a cow across to got the Mowing Machine fixed at the Blacksmiths Gordon here with Edmund from Cornwall Minnie came there to day 16th very warm W Wind Mowing Machine broke again lost time with it Edmund and I fishing got quite a lot in Webster 1 lb of Butter cream 25 Put in 3 loads of Hay for the first
