25<sup>th</sup> went with 3 Loads to Day 8 Logs Horning  
340 feet The Barrow how much a Lot of Ind  
went down to Day Bill Morris for few  
not very well I Dubt Writing am so Bad  
26<sup>th</sup> Livina Annie and George came fine cool  
Miss Margaret Hamilton Departed this  
Life 27<sup>th</sup> Miss Margaret Buried to Day  
28<sup>th</sup> The Last Day of February 1<sup>st</sup> of March  
St Davids Day The Festival of the Welsh  
Gaffy and the Seet came in Site a  
Lamb very fine Went to Mill on the 27<sup>th</sup>  
of February Went with Sumner to Lancaster  
the Ice getting Bad near Shore at Lancaster

I forgot what was we were doing as  
I did no writing for a Month Bad with  
La-grippe Cold and Rheumatism so a good  
many things I forgot 2 of The cows not very  
smart some of the cows Calved 3<sup>rd</sup> fine  
filling the Sap Barrels at the River Seander  
Drawing wood at Renshaws this is not the right  
Date 14<sup>th</sup> Stanley's Birth Day 1880 on the 4<sup>th</sup> is  
William Henry Shadgate Cameron Uncle John's Son  
Bill and George came with the Mare on the 14<sup>th</sup>  
Fernandez to Lancaster sent a letter to Kansas with 25 cents  
we got a pair of Boots for Jonia 1 Dollar Fernandez  
went again to Lancaster Bought 8 lb of Pork Sequoia  
those dates is not right about 17<sup>th</sup> of March St Patrick's  
Day Gordon here Randolph here Drew some  
sticks a very fine St Patrick's Fernandez to Williamsdown  
on the 15<sup>th</sup> Mrs Renshaw here her and Silly on the 16<sup>th</sup>  
18<sup>th</sup> on this Day of The Vicky Departed 1887  
St Joseph's Day Snowing hard 19<sup>th</sup> Sunday Seander  
Went to Hamiltons Got the Mail

I forgot Lots of things as I wrote the above on the 21<sup>st</sup>  
a flock of Wild Geese went East of March
