Saturday

1795 Cold day, frosty, cloudy and sunny, snowing
in evening. We finished cleaning peas for
seed fair and put up bag of cominet potatoes I took
them also oats and barley down to seed farm T.H.
I paid A Armstrong \$1.00 membership fee
for A. Society deposited Bergrus cheque \$75.00 also
Frodshams for oats \$4.00 paid 20c war stamp. Jim
Mills in A.M. Willie paid him service fee for Mand
\$15.00 using cream cheque in doing it. P.M. Willie
and I drove down to seed fair in slinger Mr
Leaorth of Durham judge and speaker. We got
third prize in following O.C. No 72 oats, peas,

I brought Mary up at noon she got at Russells
on Apr \$3.02 also dry goods and groceries \$1.40
on Apr. Willie drove down town at night Mand in
cutter got traveling at Russells 75c took eggs
to Russells on Apr. he brought up the Eaton parcels
order sent on Feb 29 \$16.50 7c \$3.75 tax
20.25 refund \$3.00 49c of goods to follow
