- Prayer Meeting tonight. M. G. Yellows officiated and there will be a meeting next Monday to reorganize the Temperance Society
- 4 Began to rain this morning. There were not many in church, a Mr Johnson of N. J. preached morning & evening, a M. read 3^d John Chap. text Text P. M. read 16th of John. text the immortal soul
- 5 I carded a little wool. sent a letter to Murdy \$ 5⁰⁰
- 6 Pa. & Far went to Cornwall, took cars at Cairnstown reorganized the Temperance Association Monday evening
- 7 Mostly all the snow is off, and wheels are the go. There fell a good deal of rain and now it is quite hard, and a fine foundation for snow. I had a letter from Jimmie. he is in Cape Britton, he does not like it very well. 10cts per hour and board yourself
- 8 Far & I went to Lancaster this afternoon I bought at Jundys 3 yds flannel 35 = 105 = 1 doz thread 40 = 3/4 yd velvet 55 = 2.00 bought at D. M. Crimmins 6 1/2 yds cloth 60 = 3.90 = 1 1/2 yd F. satin 4.95 2 yds cambree = 12 = 24. 1 yd canvas 15 = 1/2 yd muslin 10. 1 spool linen thread 10 = 1 1/2 doz buttons 8
- No snow yet the roads are very good and hard fine for now. The committee of Temperance met here this evening to arrange for our first meeting
- 9 Pa and Far at the bush
- 10 Far went to Lancaster Pa & Far went to the bush It began to rain about noon got 25 lbs currants at 2 cts 25, etc
