So we turned back. & My Cune & brought

21 I & Fanny went to Markham A M
I ganged in turning ground H topped
thistles in barley I took 12 bags went
to Cedar Grove Mill. I & Malcolm
has rented the Cedar Grove Grist Mill
& J Bishop has rented the Saw Mill
Colon Rector has moved into the old
Jamil homestead Joe has left the
Mill house & is going to British Col
umbia to see if he likes the place
W. Cloudy this morning fine P.M.
Sunday 22 at home Aseline & I & H
went to A B M Barkers were here
P.M. N B came too but they got windy
then they went home. W. fine & warm
looked like rain this morning
23 I drew 2 logs then began making turnip
drills H & A rolled & harrowed ground
A.M. I & A putted house at other place
& put Knothing on knots P.M. we
began sowing turnips this evening
W. very warm I went to Whitech. P.M.

June 1890
24 I finished making drills A.M.
H finished sowing then I made B
C's drills & B helped top thistles at
other place I & A painted at other
house at other place A.M. & while
P.M. W. very very warm
25 Boys topped thistles at other place
I went to Markham A.M. I & A finished
painting house at other place first time
the old part that was shut up new
last year I & I went to Markham after
supper H & A brought load of wood from
other bush I went to Cedar Grove P.M.
W. very warm. topping thistles at other
26 Boys finished topping thistles at other
place & hoed potatoes H got Frank
Shad A.M. W. very warm
27 Chores A.M. Boys done nothing
or worse than nothing P.M. I & Fanny
went to B. in law Peters, P.M. he is very
sick W. fine Breeze from north
28 Cleaned Barley A.M. I & I brought
2 loads wood from other place P.M.
a scuffled feed Corn P.M. Saml Smith
young folk were here at supper
