Sat Dec 31st clear and moderate the road getting soft and muddy. Walter drew wood I was piling it

Sun Jan 1st cloudy and soft a prospect of a storm but none came. Mr Baker was our Preacher to day

Mon Jan 2nd clear in the morning began to cloud about ten A. M and snow at noon from that out snow and bluster I piling wood and cleaning the hen house. went to the poll and voted after noon

Tue Jan 3rd clear and cold. Dick was in this fore noon to borrow my fur coat

Wed Jan 4th cloudy and cool. I was sorting over my last years papers and putting them away. part of the day I piled wood that Walter drew for me. Henry Snary called in this morning

Thu Jan 5th cloudy Snow in the fore noon

Fri Jan 6th cloudy and moderate some snow Sarah was here cleaning house and baking Bilton was here a while this after noon

Sat Jan 7th cloudy some snow. John W Snary called in this after noon

Sun Jan 8th Snow squalls most of the day Mr Mc. Mullen was our Preacher

Mon Jan 9th cloudy and cold Zero this morning snow and blustering this after noon. Walter brought me some coal from Dresden this after noon

Tue Jan 10th clear and cold another Zero day I wrote and sent away a letter to Catharine Brock. I sent to have the Bountry Gentleman paper stop Dick was in a few minutes

Wed Jan 11th a cold snowing blustering day comenced to rain about 5.30 P.M Dick called in this fore noon on his way to Florence. Walter was this after noon
