as this Morning as the anchor Ice partly hampered between  
here and Chastee I went to the Upper Point to see  
my Canoe I run home & may find the canoe at the  
Lower Point I need and I saw the Big Canoe & Red  
Canoe the Boat and the other canoe all in a Block  
on the stocks. Before the Doon. 3<sup>rd</sup> Boat Before  
the Doon & at the Upper Point and 1 at the Lower  
Point making in all 5 Canoes & 1 Boat frozen  
hard ice not taken yet and its night when froze.

24<sup>th</sup> The Ice taken Between us and Chastee  
<sup>Court Day in Newmarket</sup> But the Cut hole is Before the Doon took  
in the afternoon Between us and Francis Island  
Crows flying about 25 Christmas Day  
all alone crossed the Ice in the afternoon met  
Henry & Jim Nicholson on North side of Francis  
Island Went to Henrys no Christmas  
Came Home ice not very good Jim Hopkins  
crossed at Davids Heard of Lewis Bosell got his  
foot hurted shot at a Gull and killed  
her as I supposed put out my Canoe and  
she began to flutter and went off 25<sup>th</sup>  
Sunday Charlie came up I went to meet him  
Henry Lashy and Jim Nicholson came to fish Eels  
27<sup>th</sup> Charles went to the store for one Quart of  
Whiskey & Bushing the Road on the Ice.  
Knowing & having some of the Ice skin at the  
Little Islands

28<sup>th</sup> Charlie went home gave him a 25<sup>th</sup> Charlie went  
to Lancaster came up here to sell me  
about the Baker had Molasses & Bakers Bread  
Bushing the Road to Hamiltons.

to Bushel 1st of October threshing Wheat

in Williamstown came down to see my Mts last  
I bought a pair trunks to pay for them 13<sup>d</sup>

Peter Grant got 2 Papers from him  
Working on the Roads putting on stones  
Mr. Donell Mr. Dougall's Son-in-Law dead.  
Francis & Motty to Lancaster for flour I stopt at  
Hamiltons them working at their cellar  
The Sableberry came out of Salmon River the Boston  
Went down a schooner Anchored at the foot  
of Hamiltons Island

Walter Phillips, (Concord) 30th Sept 1859 Bass Island L. D.

Good Friday the 23<sup>rd</sup> 1859

11145 Amherst Fish Island Island April the 1<sup>st</sup> 1859  
got 4 Rats, pikes in the marsh but Wild  
Bitterns came High East Wind 23 Snowing &  
& raining High high East Wind the Water high  
cannot go to my traps charboise went up into  
4 vessels in low Salaberry in to the fort  
The Bouquet in to Salmon River. Schooner  
at anchor at the foot of Canadas Island  
got the Boys getting Ducks nests Hailstones  
24<sup>th</sup> Easter Sunday Plenty Eggs 25<sup>th</sup>  
Went to the Little Island North Side Charlie  
came up Went to Salmon River with ashes  
Boughs of the Baker 6 Loaves 26 Bought  
of Buchanan's Watch Guard 1/2 Treat 2<sup>d</sup>  
Went up to Hopkins A Race between at  
the Ranger & Whiting, 26<sup>th</sup> Went to  
Bakers said D. J. Baker for the administr.  
3 1/2 have a Summers 5<sup>p</sup> Walter Lawrence  
1/6 sold my Rats to Thomas Munroe 1  
Rats 1/6 took home Peters Repairs Archy &  
Grant mortgaging his farm to the  
Wrockly Mt Loan company's agent  
Archy Fraser 27<sup>th</sup> Hessey & George here  
I went to Scott with them to Woodville  
Island shooting at Black Birds set 40 traps  
The fashion went in to Salmon River 28<sup>th</sup>  
got 12 or 13 Rats Went to Attards Point took  
Dinner on the Island stopped on Curvilles  
Island 29<sup>th</sup> got 8 Rats searching for the  
Big Trap a long time came home Rats  
going down fine weather got 6 Rats for my  
Shane John Nicholson here got some  
Hay Planting corn Making garden Broketthe  
Plough got Boxes.
