Wednesday May 27th 1879

we had a light rain yesterday, but all is again dried
up and parched, getting our Potato land ready for
planting, have sold my little House to the Methodists
and will give possession on July 1st what will become
of Dr Middleton? Hard times will tell soon, but today he
has gone to the City to be in time to welcome the Princess &
Marquis of Lorne!!! Oh my Country what I suffer for thee!
Did ever poor Charlie Allen of Elora reckon that his daughter
would be dragged around the world at the heels of such
a man as W. G. M. alas we know not what we are
come to. And he may yet be successful in some other
walk of life although I doubt it - at least I pity her.
