 Snowed this evening Rained Virgin M.
 night 9th Soft Raining kind of warm
 a Fishing Light out to night Windy

 on the knees slippery walking in the
 morning Randolph and Spunk fishing to night
 got 11 Wind Raised snow storm in Britain

 Renshaw and Stanley went for Eels got 2
 Randolph here brought the Star after
 Ducks on the Little Island South side
 very fine Day warm sun
 Stanley 13th fine Day E Wind some shooting
 to Day St Lucy the Martyr's Day Thawing
 very fine Seander came from Lennards
 got 4 lb of Butter 25 cents all 1 Dollar
 got a Plate took 4 of our Jane Ducks
 for Decoys took Corn put them in a Box
 Wind changed to night Windy some
 14th UNFORTUNATE Day West Wind
 Windy fine and warm few Drops of Rain
 this morning snow disappearing in spots
 High high South Wind and West commenced
 to Rain to night and Rained heavy all night
 till morning and 15th FORTUNE to Day this
 morning froze some and snowed some
 Windy to Day some cold DUCK Shooting
 Ends to Day Sunday very cold night
 16th fine fair and Frosty Seander came from Lennards
 made some ice 17th Seander came from Lennards
 may's done hunting with Mr James has his
 boat crossed to Sumner's town Bought 50 lb Flour
 at Sea and Mail Ice skimed to Renshaw's Island
 freezing hard to night Gordon chopping
 Captain A. J. Baker
