- 1 Thursday. Fine bright day pretty cold
 Farquhar came about 10.30 a.m.
 he fixed sticks for our kitchen door (asked cloth to them) 70 2
- 2 Mended the spring in one of our kitchen blinds
 70 two loaves 12. Far left after dinner 12
- 3 70 1 loaf 6. Milk 42. Jimmie gave it to Laru buy 48
- 4 Fine day I was not in church. Went off 25 25
- 5 Municipal election, today, and some are trying to repeal the local option act I went at 10.2 a.m. and voted L. O. and for councilors
- 6 Bright in forenoon, looks like a thaw, 1/2 gall coal oil 10 matches 5 - 2 loaves 12 - 37

- 7 Lamp chimney 15
- 8 Fine day Murely went to N. Branch
 70 2 loaves 12, sent letter to Marin. One to Eatons for samples ^{chipmunk} the 15 brook for to give another 174

- 9 Friday. W. H. & F. M. meet in vestry I walked down Mrs John Dingwall drove me home
 I paid my fee 1.00 off to both society 25 1.50
 Renewed my subscription for the Leaflet and Pioneer 15 each 30. 5 for Tea fund 35
 Paid Mrs Cook 25 for little book Gold Coin 25
- 10 Storming a little This is preparation day for our Communion. A Rev Scott who assisted at Prayers last night. preached today. I took a cold yesterday so I could not go to church. Mrs Govin sent me a loaf of bread and a tin of biscuit her own make 70 2 loaves 12. Milk 42.
- 11 Cold sent my off for Mipions 1.00 25 for Gen 1.25
- 12 Stormy and cold Nathan D. drew two loads of wood
- 13 Bright now very cold Mercury at sun rise 30 below
 Mrs Cattasack sent word that she could not give us any more. Milk, we got a qt 1/2 = 9^{cts} mercury 30 below
- 14 Another cold mercury at 24 but it is uglier than yesterday.
