## Treatment of Granulating Wounds.

Dr. H. Bergeat recommends the use of a stream of hot or cold dry air to promote cicatrization, the excessive granulation being reduced within a short time. He has found that the discolored and edematous wound surface soon becomes flattened down and assumes a healthy appearance. Besides, there is a diminution of the secretion, which also prevents epithelial formation. This treatment is unattended with the least irritation or pain. To obtain satisfactory results the drying process should be performed at least once daily.—*Bergeat; Münch. Med. Woch.*
