

Broton March 1889

Thu Mar 28th clear and cool, the ground froze to hard to plow this morning. Walter plowing this afternoon, John back on his own place.

I was writing a letter to Alice and gathering

Fri Mar 29th cloudy fine snow in the fore noon. high wind from the North and cold in the after noon.

I was boiling Sap. Walter not plowing to day.

Sat Mar 30th clear and cold. a hard frost the ground to hard for plowing. I Sugard of about 45 lbs this fore noon after noon not doing much of any thing.

Sun Mar 31st a cloudy and and stormy day about two inches of snow fell last night and this morning. commenced to rain about 9 A. M. and steady until 6 P. M. than commenced snowing again.

Mon. Apr 1st clear part of the day. the snow most gone about two inches fell last night. I was emptying rain water out of the sap pails. and cutting wood and gathering sap.

Broton April 1889

Tue Apr 2nd cloudy a little snow last night and rain this fore noon. I was gathering and boiling Sap. the boys attending to the stock. to wet to plow.

Wed Apr 3rd cloudy high wind in the after noon and cool. I was boiling Sap fore part of the day after noon Sugard of about 45 lbs. Charles and Sarah were here.

Thu Apr 4th clear part of the day. I finished sugar making for this season. went up to Davis Butlers and voted for the Scott act. called at Samuel Peters and paid my Blacksmith bill \$2.20 paid John W. Henry \$20.00 that I borrowed of him.

Fri Apr 5th cloudy snow and blustering in the after noon. not doing much to day.

Sat Apr 6th clear and and pleasant over head sloppy under foot. there was about 3 inches of snow on the ground this morning it is
