- 4. Fine day, Jimmie caught a spike today and one yesterday, got from Mellinore about 1/2 cts of syrup 70 4 lbs butter at factory 29^{ds} p. to 112, He and wife took tea with us
- 5. Jimmie & Spike Mundy took Uncle Sandy to make calls, were at John Mc Gillis' (Lanark), Dougald's old house, to see Charlott, down to the depot round to D. Dan's then home
- 6. Rain and snow all day, Uncle Sandy went to remain over night at J. C. Brown's About 7.30 fire was discovered in Mc Dougald's hen house, it was a big fire, the people worked hard and kept the fire from spreading to the barns, 70 2 pans bread 48
- 7. Fine day, but cold, sold three doz eggs 16, for doz, 70 1/2 lb. P. tea, due bill for 28
- 8. Dull day, 70 raked out 25, Uncle Sandy bot sugar & syrup from D. Mc Goughy, Account of an earthquake in India, Lahore being the province suffered most
- 9. Fine day, I was not in church, Jimmie had a bush sold on Thursday evening about 7.30 the fire at Mc Dougald's, and Jimmie worked again on Saturday evening about 6. P. M a fire was discovered in Mc Dougald's wood.
