Mon Nov 26th cloudy high wind from the North. we were drawing turnips in the fore. after noon was piling them. Soft snow the latter part of ~~the day~~ the day.

Tue Nov 27th cloudy and some snow, went over to John W. Snareys this fore noon after noon was not doing much.

Wed Nov 28th cloudy and soft. we cleaned up a small load of wheat in the fore noon, John and I went with it to Thamesville in the after noon sold it to James Mayhew for 99^{cts} per bush.

Thu Nov 29th cloudy rain and snow part of the day. I commenced to pull turnips they were so wet and mussey I had to quit pulling and went and chopped wood, roads are dreadful bad.

Fri Nov 30th cloudy and soft. I was chopping wood part of the day, we ought to have been plowing the mare to lame to ~~do~~ do any thing.

December 1888

Sat Dec 1st light clouds and moderate I finished pulling turnips. Walter was away cutting wood for Lizzie Boyington, we had the vet up from ⁱⁿ Dresden to see the mare.

Sun Dec 2nd cloudy and moderate

Mon Dec 3rd cloudy drizzling snow most of the day and melted as fast as it came, we were working about the barns a good share of the day.

Tue Nov 4th cloudy and moderate. I was cutting wood Walter attending the stock.

Wed Dec 5th cloudy snow in the after noon we butchered the old sow this fore noon, after noon I was digging and boiling potatoes.

Thu Dec 6th cloudy about an inch of snow fell last night Walter and I put up a load of grain to get chopped in the fore noon, after noon was cutting wood.

Fri Dec 7th clear part of the day and moderate. Walter took the grain to Mill to get chopped. I was chopping wood.
